Monday opened with devotions and reflection on dreams. Balloon Noodle tennis was next. They so enjoy playing this fun exercise game and this week 50's music was playing in the background. Residents gathered at 10 a.m. for the reading of short stories. Residents enjoy this time and the conversation that goes with it. Card playing took the residents to dinnertime. Our afternoon brought bingo with homemade rhubarb sauce. The rhubarb has been beautiful this summer and residents enjoy it, and they also have fond memories of growing, picking and enjoying rhubarb. Connecting residents with a memory of the past such as rhubarb is always a great idea.

Tuesday started with Verb Generation, the word game that assists in keeping our minds active. Our word for the day was actor. Residents listed 25 verbs that describe what an actor does.
