power Linton/HMB at Turtle Lake-Mercer High School.

Despite playing in front of their home crowd, Central McLean was unable to keep pace with the Lions’ relentless attack, dropping the match in straight sets (0-3).

Linton/HMB’s strong serving and quick offensive rhythm forced the Cougars onto their heels early, and while Central McLean showed flashes of strong play, they were unable to sustain momentum long enough to claim a set.

Just two nights later, however, the Cougars rebounded in impressive fashion.

Traveling to White Shield on Wednesday, September 11, Central McLean took command from the opening serve and never let go.

The Cougars swept the Warriors 3-0, using crisp passing and effective net play to control the tempo.

It was the type of complete performance the team had been working toward, showing improvement in execution and confidence on the court.

Now sitting at 2-3 overall, the Cougars remain competitive in both Region 4 and District 8 standings.

Flasher leads the way with a 13-2-1 overall record and a perfect 4-0 in region play, while Central McLean, New Salem-Almont, and Standing Rock

all hover near the middle of the standings as early-season matches continue to sort the field.

The Cougars won’t have much time to dwell on their mixed results, as a demanding schedule looms.

They return home Tuesday, September 16, to face Garrison in Turtle Lake before heading to Wilton-Wing on Thursday, September 18.

The following week will see the team host Mandaree

in Underwood on Tuesday, September 23, before traveling to Washburn on Thursday, September 25.

With several district and region contests ahead, Central McLean has the chance to solidify its footing and build momentum.

If the Cougars can replicate their focus and execution from the White Shield match, they’ll be in position to climb the standings in the weeks to come.



Resolution Declaring Work Necessary for Street Improvement District No. 2025-1

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TURTLE LAKE, MCLEAN COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, that it is hereby found, determined, and declared to be necessary and expedient for the City of Turtle Lake to construct Street Improvement District No. 2025-1 consisting of city-wide street reconstruction, including replacement patching and overlay and all other appurtenances, in connection with the above specified improvements, in accordance with and as described in the resolution creating said district adopted September 8, 2025, and the Engineer's Report which has been prepared by the Engineer for the City of Turtle Lake and approved by this Council, which resolution and Engineer's Report together with an estimate of the probable cost of the work are now on file in the office of the City Auditor and are open to public inspection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the entire cost of said improvements be specially assessed against the benefited property in said improvement district in amounts proportionate to and not exceeding the benefits to be derived by them respectively from said improvement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the owners of the property liable to be specially assessed for said improvements may file written protests against the said improvements within thirty (30) days after the first publication of this resolution to-wit: On the 20th day of

October, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. meet at the Turtle Lake School Gymnasium in the City of Turtle Lake for the purpose of hearing and determining the sufficiency of any protests so filed and of taking any such further action with respect to said improvements as may then be deemed necessary and expedient.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to cause this resolution including a map of the improvement district, to be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper of the City of Turtle Lake, North Dakota.
