New Salem-Almont Drama team places in first at regional competition

New Salem-Almont's High School Drama Team's one-act performance of "The Blind Spot" by Steven Stack received first place at the regional competition in Hazen last Wednesday, Nov. 12. With a first-place finish, the team has advanced to the state competition which will begin on Nov. 24 in Jamestown.

Though their performance earned them the top spot at the regional competition, there are still plenty of elements of the play that can reportedly be improved.

Senior performer Shelby Kalvoda, who plays "Katie", says that the drama team as a collective have plenty to improve upon before the state competition in Jamestown. "We obviously have a lot of work to do, and we could still make a lot of changes to make [our performance] better, but I feel confident in making it to semifinals and keeping our state rank," Kalvoda

With the first performance of the play occurring only a few days prior to regionals on Nov. 7, NSAHS director of Drama/Speech Laura Muth said that her cast of performers put on a stronger performance on Wednesday in Hazen compared to the first showing in New Salem. Due to a late switch in the play being per-

formed, Muth stated that she was understanding if her team struggled with memorizing their lines, which they did.

"Friday night I felt like we played a six out of ten, performance wise. It was a good show; I don't feel like they put on a bad show, it just wasn't at the same level as Wednesday," Muth said. "After the performance [on Friday], I looked at the kids and said, 'we got work to do,' and they [said], 'yeah, we can see it," so then Monday and Tuesday, we really did work hard on it."

Adding that her students were strongly engaged and threw themselves into their roles despite the change in the play they would perform, Muth said the judges' ballets the team received after their performance on Wednesday were not as full of advice and ideas. "They did a really good job...I would say [they performed] nine out of ten on Wednesday."

Like Kalvoda, Muth is also confident in the team's ability to perform well enough to receive honors at the state level but knows there's work to be done.

Some of that practice and work to improve upon their performances will include stronger stage-building/design, music selection and monologues/soliloquies. "We've got the headstone on the stage that represents Luke after he's passed. Each character comes out

and talks to that headstone at some point and explains to him how they're feeling and what they're going through since his passing," Muth said. "We're going to take one day to just really drill down on those monologues, and then we're going to kind of weave that back into the rest of it."

Another element of the performance Muth shared that can and will be improved upon is stage presence/awareness. Referring to an honest mistake made on the Friday evening show in New Salem by one of the performers where they bumped and knocked down a set design piece, Muth noted that mistakes of any kind could potentially impact scoring. "Those little [mistakes] are fine when you're on the stage because things happen, but when you're in a performance and the judges are looking for any little thing to mark you down...You never know what the judges are going to say, and you never know what's going to happen on stage."
