

A happy day: EACF distributes 2025 grants

Ellendale, ND – Smiles were on lots of faces last Wednesday, as board members of the Ellendale Area Community Foundation handed out checks to help fund fifteen local community projects. The total amount dispersed in the 2025 grant round was \$40,310. Recipients were as follows:

To everyone reading this, wherever you may be: The people of Forbes cordially invite everyone to join in the celebration of their 140 years as a town. The little community on the South Dakota border is a youngster compared to Ellendale, having organized simultaneously with the extension of the Great Northern Railroad from Ellendale in 1905.

As has long been the tradition, Forbes will host **Dickey County's best July 4 parade**, and it will begin on the south side of town at 10:30. Anyone who would like to join in with a float is encouraged to do so. You may contact Lori Brandenburger or Bobbi Jo Salberg if you need details.

Also as traditional, **the great Forbes Fireworks display will begin at dusk.**

Joan Tviet Hoffman, who for many years has worked with loyal volunteers to preserve and honor the heritage of the Forbes area, noted several features of the community that the public should know.

- The Presbyterian Church, which now houses the museum of the Cou-teau Hills Historical Center, was built in 1906 and has stood proudly there ever since. It has a history of serving our community, including as a Youth Center.

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

The City of Ellendale will be accepting sealed bids for the sale of (621 3rd St N.) Lot 12, Block 10 ELC Addn, Ellendale, ND

Bids must be marked "Lot 12, Block 10, ELC Addn., Ellendale, ND" on the outside of the envelope AND contain the bid amount, intended purpose and time-frame for completion.

- Property must be developed with new construction complying with intended purpose; all applicable zoning and building codes; and construction must begin within 1 year of signing a Purchase Agreement; AND the said construction shall be completed within 2 years from the date of approved Building Permit.
- Garage on property must be made secure within 12 months of purchase date.
- Minimum bid of \$500.00 per lot.
- Successful bidder will enter into a purchase agreement with the City.
- The property will be forfeited and shall revert back to the city without further action if purchaser fails to fulfill all Purchase Agreement terms.
- A Quitclaim Deed will be issued upon successful completion of all Purchase Agreement terms.
- Bids must be received at City Hall at 55 3rd Ave S by 4:00 PM on July 14, 2025. Bids will be opened at 6:30 PM that evening during the regular City Council meeting.
- The top and best bidders for said parcel shall have the opportunity to increase bids for the parcel through competitive oral bidding, following the bid opening during council meeting.
- The City reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any bid irregularities in its sole discretion. If no bids are accepted for any parcel, the City reserves the right to alter any and all terms for a future sale of such parcel.
- In the sole discretion of the City, the Purchase Agreement may be in the form of a Contract for Deed with terms substantially similar to the blank form example, a copy of which may be reviewed at City Hall prior to the written bid submission deadline.
