6:00 pm - City Hall and Zoom Virtual

This meeting was held at the City Hall and virtual Zoom Meeting option was also available

Mayor Flaherty called the regular monthly meeting to order at 6:00 pm with Council members in attendance: Belgarde, Lee, Meidinger, and Crabtree via Zoom. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Absent: Langeliers

City Employees present: Auditor Gunn, Deputy Auditor Schmidt, Attorney Kelly; PW Monroe via Zoom, and Police Chief Knutson

Others attending: W. Senger, Interstate Engineering; Ross Merkel, separate sign-in sheet available

Mosquito Issues: Ross Merkel approached council regarding the mosquito issue. Wants to know why City cannot spray more than once a week or down alleys. PW Monroe stated he is spraying more than the industry standard of once every two weeks. They only spray down streets

Langeliers arrives 6:10 PM

Denison moves, Meidinger seconds to have PW Monroe spray down streets and alleys for next two weeks to see if that makes a difference. All members, aye. Motion carries.

Dilapidated Houses: Ross Merkel is concerned about the dilapidated houses around town stating it attracts rodents and other causes of concern, would like something done about it. Can be a lengthy, expensive process. Lee and Meidinger to get a list of homes from around town to investigate further and start the process to work on aetting them taken care of.

Wade: EMS Building: Construction started, footings poured. Progressing well. Two pay estimates. PE #2 for \$135,000 and PE #3 for \$27,000. Lee moves. Denison seconds to pay estimates #2 and #3. Roll Call: Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison- yes. Motion carries.

Wade: Ellendale Acres: Utilities mostly in roadway built, and soils testing to check now in progress and will start on gravel soon. Culverts arriving soon to place under driveways to get ditches drained out. Ditches along 6th Ave in between Ellendale Acres and Fair grounds are deep and rough, bringing safety concerns with keeping them that deep. Can keep them that deep and finish dirt work as is or extend the culverts underneath those areas to make it a smaller ditch which would cost an extra \$60.000-\$70.000. Denison moves, Belgrade seconds to add culverts, which will be on final balance change order. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison- yes. Motion carries. PE #2 for \$124,956.39, Meidinger moves, Langeliers seconds to pay PE #2. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison- yes. Motion carries.

Wade: City Wide Street Project: Things are different for Prairie Dog Funds and Flex Funding this year, which means they have funds available for road projects for day, September 10, 2025, at 7:30pm at grants. City to possibly put together paperwork to apply for grants to add more roads to be done for next street project. Engineering Agreement: Terms and conditions for services provided by Interstate Engineering for the Street Improvement Project. Lee moves, Denison seconds to approve this engineering agreement. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison- yes. Motion carries.

Bid Opening: One bid received for 621 3rd Ave N, from Mark Rumney in the amount of \$3000 for the intended purpose of putting a single-family home. Meidinger moves. Langeliers seconds to accept the \$3000 bid. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison-yes. Motion carries.

City Surplus Bids: One bid received for 2022 X394 for \$3975 and one bid received for 1990 4700 International Truck for \$8600. Lee motions, Denison seconds to accept the bids received for those items. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Denison- Yes. Motion carries.

Wade: 87th Ave Shoulder: Recommendation to wait until the road project for 87th Ave to begin to fix the shoulder at that time. Blumhardt Allev: Still looking for a contractor that is interested in doing

the work. Preliminary Budget Hearing: Motion by Lee, second by Belgarde, to set the Preliminary Budget Hearing for September 8, 2025, at 6 PM.

Walking Trail Concerns: November 2016 city council passed no motorized vehicles on walking trail, April 2018 city council passed snowmobiles can be used on walking trail between November 1 to April 30. Concerns that signs currently posted say no motorized vehicles should be changed to say excluding snowmobiles. PW Monroe to post new signs along walking trail.

NDDOT 281 Concerns: Email from NDDOT Engineer concerning marking Hwy 11 at the corner of Hwy 11 and Hwy 281. When it gets busy in that spot during certain times of the day more than one vehicle is trying to navigate the turn onto 281. Meidinger moves, Denison seconds to do the longer hatch marks on Hwy 11 according to the recommendation from NDDOT. Roll Call vote: Lee, Belgarde, Langeliers, Crabtree, Meidinger, Deni-

son- yes. Motion carries.

Re. 2025 Fall Wild Turkey Season


The North Dakota Game & Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations and changes for the 2025 fall wild turkey hunting proclamation.
