[¶1] On March 12, 2025, the Governor notified this Court of the retirement of the Honorable David E. Reich as Judge of the District Court in the South Central Judicial District, effective June 6, 2025. Therefore, under N.D.C.C. § 27-05-02.1, a vacancy in the office of district judge will be created upon Judge Reich's retirement. Section 27-05-02.1, N.D.C.C., requires the Supreme Court to determine whether the judgeship is necessary for effective judicial administration in the South Central Judicial District or whether the judgeship may be transferred. R. 7.2 and receive statewide caseload data from the State Court Administrator's office. - Total moose licenses increased by 54 to 296.
- All moose licensees and Unit E1E, E1W, E2, E6 and E7 elk licensees may hunt during both the Bow Season and the
- Regular Season until license is filled. Moose Hunting Units M1C and M4 will remain closed in 2025.



2025 FIRE EMERGENCY & BURN RESTRICTIONS DECLARATIONS OLIVER COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA MARCH 13, 2025

WHEREAS, the County of Oliver, North Dakota is under abnormally dry conditions with significant vegetative fuels available; and WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being and public safety of citizens in Oliver County; and WHEREAS, the cost of emergency response and the inordinate equipment wear/tear may be beyond available County resources. WHEREAS, Oliver County wishes to regulate activities within the County which post a potential hazard for such loss, should the present weather conditions continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Oliver County Commissioners declare a Fire Emergency Declaration for all of Oliver County to include all incorporated cities; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Oliver County Commis-

sioners declares a Fire Emergency and Automatic Burn Restriction

WHAT'S INCLUDED (when the ND Rangeland Fire Danger Rating is Very High, Extreme and/or a Red Flag Warning) No Open Burning: includes burning of leaves, grass clippings, garbage/pits, ignition of farm or crop residue/land, hay land, sloughs, construction debris, fallen trees, fireworks (ground & aerial) and campfires/ bonfires/recreational fires.

WHAT'S EXCLUDED

Controlled Devices only when device(s) (gas, charcoal, woodfired/pellet grills, patio fireplaces and chimineas, gas camp stoves, and smokers/pellet grills) is/are on a hard, non-organic surface and 15 feet away from vegetation and an extinguisher or water is available on site.

ANY INDIVIDUALWHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN RESTRICTION IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500.00 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS
