100 years ago
States Attorney Geroge Thom, Jr. and wife, residents of Denhoff for more than ten years, moved to McClusky this week, it being more convenient for Attorney Thom to look after his business here. Attorney Thom, who is also editor of the Denhoff Voice, lived in Denhoff but had his law offices in Goodrich for the past few years. He has moved everything to McClusky and has rented his home in Denhoff. The Thom's are occupying the Anton P. Ness residences in east McClusky.

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Seventeen young men were left in the cold, seventeen young men in terrible tempera when the masquerade dance at Turtle Lake last Friday evening ended. Seventeen overcoats, a number of hats and several pairs of gloves were stolen while the dance as in progress. Aaron Herr, of McClusky, was one of the seventeen to be minus a coat when the dance was over. About eight other local young men attended the affair but lost none of their clothes.

Not one of the stolen coats nor any trace of them could be found, though officials were notified and many helped hunt for them. immediately after the dance. Most of the coats were taken from cars, though some were even taken from the Turtle Lake Dance Hall.

McClusky Lions club will commemorate the 20th anniversary of its founding at a combined charter night and ladies night banquet to be held Thursday evening, November 2, at McClusky High School gymnasium. The local club, organized twenty years ago, held it charter night program on July 11, 1930, at which time D.E. Shipley of Bismarck, deputy district governor of Lions International, presented the charter. The club listed 40 charter members, 5 of whom are members of the organization today. They are I.A. Boling, John J. Dahl, R.G. Glarum, R.P. Moore, and Hubert Oliver. The McClusky club today has 41 members.

A total of 23 haystacks were consumed for an estimated loss of \$11,000, reported Sonny Hoffer, rural fire chief. Faul had insurance on the hay, however, Neighbors brought tractors and stack movers to move nearby haystacks to safety. 3. Whether the proposed incorporators are possessed of such character, integrity, reputation, and financial standing that their connection with the company will be beneficial to the public welfare of the community in which such company is proposed to be established.
