## Granger bound for nationals

Granger recently competed at the 2025 USATF Region 8 Junior Olympic Championships at the Iowa State University Cyclone Sports Complex in Ames, Iowa on July 12-13.

He competed in the 17-18 age division in the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash and long jump events.

He placed 17th in the 100-meter dash with a time of 11.27 seconds and 14th in the 200 with a time of 23.07 seconds.
