Granger bound for nationals

by Kyrie Dauenhauer Porter Granger, son of Scott and Barb Granger, has officially punched his ticket to nationals. Granger recently competed at the 2025 USATF Region 8 Junior Olympic Championships at the Iowa State University Cyclone Sports Complex in Ames, Iowa on July 12-13. He competed in the 17-18 age division in the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash and long jump events. He placed 17th in the 100-meter dash with a time of 11.27 seconds and 14th in the 200 with a time of 23.07 seconds. In long jump, he leapt a distance of 20 feet, 11 3/4 inches to earn a sixth place finish to qualify for the 2025 USATF National Junior Olympic Championships on July 21-27 in Savannah, Ga. To qualify for this meet, athletes needed to place in the top eight. However, Granger isn’t the only local face that was seen competing in Iowa. Krew Wolsky, Peyton Harrington and Paxton Harrington were also competing at the 2025 USATF Region 8 Junior Olympic Championships. All three competed on the Team NoDak Youth team. Wolsky, the son of Kevin and Jennifer Wolsky, competed in the 11-12 age division in the 200-meter hurdles, 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash and pole vault. Wolsky topped all in the boys pole vault after clearing 9 feet, 3 1/4 inches. He also placed sixth in the 200-meter hurdles with a time of 29.16 seconds. He will compete at nationals in both pole vault and the 200-meter hurdles. In the 100, Wolsky placed 20th with a time of 13.20 seconds and 11th in the 200 with a time of 26.06 seconds. Paxton Harrington competed in the 15-16 age division in the 100- and 200-meter dashes. He placed 20th in the 200 with a time of 24.57 seconds and 23rd in the 100 with a time of 11.86 seconds. His brother, Peyton, competed alongside Granger in the 17-18 age division also in the 100- and 200-meter dashes. He ran a time of 23.78 seconds in the 200 to place 23rd and a time of 11.76 seconds in the 100 to finish in 30th. Paxton and Peyton are the sons of Jamie and Danielle Harrington. Results from Granger and Wolsky at the 2025 USATF National Junior Olympic Championships will be included in our July 28 edition of the New Rockford Transcript.
