ATTENTION LOGAN COUNTY SOYBEAN GROWERS: 2026 NORTH DAKOTA SOYBEAN COUNCIL (NDSC) ELECTION NOMINEES SOUGHT FOR **LOGAN COUNTY REPRESENTATIVE**

On or about December 18, 2025, the NDSC will mail a nomination form to soybean producers of record in the above-named county. To be considered, nomination forms must be filed with the County Extension Agent for the above-named county. The County Exten-sion Agent must receive the completed nomination form by January 12, 2026, or your mailed-in form must be postmarked no later than January 12, 2026. If you do not receive a nomination form in the mail, contact your County Extension Agent or the NDSC to obtain one. Look for the green envelope in the mail.

After nominations are validated by the County Extension Agent, names of the nominees will be sent to the NDSC to be placed on the 2025 ballot. On or about February 17, 2026, the NDSC will mail to soybean producers of record an election ballot with instructions. Look for the blue envelope in the mail. Completed ballots must be post-marked by March 5, 2026. The newly elected County Representative will be notified by March 12, 2026. In late March, those County Representatives will elect one County Representative to serve on the NDSC board of direc-

City Council Monthly Meeting Monday, December 1st, 2025 Napoleon City Hall 7:30 p.m. (Subject to council review and approval)

Mayor Moos called the regular meeting to order. Alderman present: Rod Kleppe, Rich Bjerklie, Bob Humann, John Wald, Clark Haas and Mike Heying.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited

No Additions to the agenda. No public comments received.

Kleppe motioned to approve the minutes from November 3rd, 2025, meeting, Wald seconded, motion

Bjerklie motioned to approve the financial report as presented, Heying seconded, motion carried

Grant Dockter from Moore Engineering sent in the Engineer's Report. The paperwork for the NDDOT Flex Fund has been submitted and we should hear if the city is approved by the end of the year. The paperwork for the Infrastructure Revolving Loan Fund for city-wide chip seal will be submitted by week's end.

STREETS: It was reported that the snowplow truck is broke down. After discussion on whether to put a lot of money into repairing it or replace it, it was decided to look for something different. Mayor Moos said he has been dealing with one but wanted the council to give their opinion on it. After some more discussion, Kleppe motioned to have Mayor Moos make the decision on the truck, Wald seconded, all hands raised in favor, motion carried. It was decided that the snowplow truck would be paid for out of the capital fund account.

Kelly Repnow called in as a guest in regard to a road constructed on his land by CHS for access to a soybean storage facility just west of his property. Repnow requested a letter of intention regarding the pending agreement between Repnow and CHS. Repnow was inquiring whether the city has any intention of enacting right of eminent domain from the city's viewpoint. After Repnow read a letter from City Attorney, Joseph Hanson stating his advice on not signing any agreement and Mayor Moos stating that the city has no opposition to this matter between Repnow and CHS, Repnow said he will work with CHS on making an agreement on this matter.

Kleppe motioned to pay all bills as presented Humann seconded, motion carried. Bill from Logan County for the culverts for the 4th St. Project has also been paid.
