

North Dakota Supreme Court jus- Jensen said he would not seek retices Lisa Fair McEvers and Jerod Tufte have announced their candidacy for chief justice after Justice Jon Jensen announced last week he will step down from the helm.

of the five North Dakota Supreme Court justices and state district court judges. The North Dakota court system mailed ballots out to eligible voters on Monday, according to its website.

The ballots will be counted Dec. 10.

The position is selected by a vote

The count will be livestreamed on the court's website. Fair McEvers has served as a justice since 2014, when she was appointed by former Gov. Jack Dalrymple to fill a vacancy left by former Justice Mary Muehlen Maring. Fair McEvers was then elected to the court to serve a two-year term

She previously pursued the position of chief justice in 2019. Fair McEvers was formerly a state district court judge and North Dakota

in 2016 and a 10-year term in 2018.
