The season will run from Apr.12 through May 18. There are 8,547 licenses available in 21 open units. Bag limit is one bearded or male wild turkey. Unit 21 (Hettinger and Adams counties), which has been closed for several years, has been extended into units 44 and 06 to allow for mor opportunities.

**More than just an ambulance driver**

**NORTH DAKOTA EMS ASSOCIATION**

In the vast and often rural expanse of North Dakota, the emergency medical services (EMS) system is essential for responding to medical emergencies. When an ambulance arrives at your door, how do you know what level of care you're receiving? Are all ambulance drivers the same? The answer is no—North Dakota offers a range of EMS levels, each providing different levels of care based on the severity of the emergency and the resources available in a given area.

In North Dakota, emergency medical services are typically divided into two main categories: Advanced Life Support (ALS) and Basic Life Support (BLS). Each level has different responsibilities and capabilities, often reflecting the population density and the specific healthcare needs of the community.

ALS services are typically found in larger cities like Bismarck, Fargo, and Williston. However, many smaller communities are now starting to offer ALS by employing paramedics as part of their team. Paramedics are now found in communities such as Elgin, Medora, Michigan, and Killdeer. These ambulances are equipped with advanced medical equipment and staffed with highly trained personnel capable of providing complex, life-saving care. Paramedics administer treatments such as intubation, intravenous drug administration, and advanced cardiac monitoring, making them capable of managing critical patients who require sophisticated medical

interventions during transport.

BLS services are more common in less populated, rural areas of the state. These ambulances are often staffed with CPR Drivers, Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs), Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs), and Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians (AEMTs) who provide essential care, such as CPR, basic wound care, and stabilization during transport. BLS services are well-equipped, trained, and critical in providing immediate care until advanced medical help arrives.

A crucial part of the EMS system involves the personnel. EMS personnel differ in training, certification, and the level of care they are able to provide.

**•CPR Drivers:**  
 In some cases, ambulances are driven by individuals trained primarily in CPR and basic first aid.

These drivers assist in transporting patients.

**•Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs):**  
 These individuals are trained to provide basic emergency care, including CPR, bleeding control, and stabilizing a patient's condition. EMRs are often the first responders on the scene, working to stabilize patients until more advanced care arrives.

Many of our local Firefighters and Law Enforcement are trained EMRs.

**•Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs):**  
 EMTs have received additional training compared to EMRs and are equipped to manage more complex medical emergencies. They are capable of performing CPR, controlling bleeding, providing oxygen

therapy, administering certain medications, and advanced airway management, along with many more skills. EMTs are often the backbone of Basic Life Support services, providing essential care in emergencies.

**•Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians (AEMTs):**  
 AEMTs have received further training than EMTs, allowing them to perform more advanced procedures like administering medications, starting intravenous lines, and using advanced airway devices. AEMTs are crucial in bridging the gap between BLS and ALS care.

**Paramedics:**  
 Paramedics are the highest level of EMS providers. With extensive training, including advanced cardiac life support, drug administration, invasive medical procedures, and are responsible for stabilizing patients before they reach the hospital. The differences in EMS levels also reflect the geographical challenges in North Dakota. In urban areas like Fargo and Bismarck, ALS services are more readily available however, in rural areas, the need for

Basic Life Support is more common, as fewer paramedics are available to cover large, sparsely populated regions. North Dakota's EMS system is designed to meet the needs of both urban and rural communities, ensuring that individuals receive the appropriate level of care no matter where they are. Understanding the differences between Advanced Life Support and Basic Life Support, and the roles of the providers is crucial for communities to appreciate the dedicated efforts of emergency responders across the state.

While it might seem like all ambulance drivers are the same, the reality is far more complex. From CPR providers to paramedics, each level of EMS staff brings different skills and expertise to the table, tailored to the needs of the patient and the resources of the region. Whether you're in a bustling city or a remote town, North Dakota's EMS system is designed to ensure the best care possible for every emergency. Understanding these differences is important not just for those in need of care, but also for the communities that rely on these heroes to keep them safe.
