Trygve Hammer delighted about 140 locals attending the annual District 24 Dem-NPL Roundup held Thursday, October 30 at The Reserve at Woodland in Valley City. Hammer, who was North Dakota's Dem-NPL candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives in 2024, held his audience's attention with a blend of humor and straight talk about what makes his party strong.
