





the memory of all prisoners of war (POW) and service members missing in action (MIA). It is sponsored by the Stark County Veterans Association.

The event's keynote speaker will be Kathy Strong of California. In 1972, as a teenager, Strong began wearing a bracelet engraved with the name of Sgt. 1st Class James Moreland, a Green Beret medic who went missing in Vietnam

Strong wore the bracelet every day for 38 years until Moreland's remains were recovered and returned to his family in early 2011.

Since then, Strong has launched a campaign to place an engraved brick in Moreland's memory in all 50 states. North Dakota will be the 47th state to receive a brick.
