Primary residence tax credit applications open for ND mobile-home owners

BISMARCK — North Dakota mobile-home owners will have a special application period for the primary residence tax credit open from July 14 to Sept. 1.

According to a release from the North Dakota Office of the State Tax Commissioner, the supplemental requirement is in addition to any previously submitted application for a mobile home.

"The supplemental application window for mobile homeowners is a

one-time requirement only to allow credits to be reflected as a deduction against tax owed on their property tax statement, rather than the issuance of credits through the delayed abatement and refund check process, one year later," the release said.

The office defines a mobile home as a "prefabricated structure built in a factory on a permanently attached chassis" that often remains in place but can be moved.
