

Wanner.

He and Roshau went on to explain that while it may be hard for their grandparents or family members to talk about their time in combat, it is an important pursuit, lest their heroism be

forgotten. The Dickinson High seniors then spent an hour of their school day touring the exhibit and reading veterans' stories - some of which are

being told for the first time. During this time, they put Wanner's advice into practice, as they asked questions and listened to several of his and Brauhn's accounts of their time spent in ser-

vice to their country. *Images of Freedom* is open at SWAG-SC until November. From there, Roshau hopes to see it travel to other locations in southwest North Dakota in order to promote more conversations about veterans' experiences.
