



# Sculpture in Grand Forks veterans park honors military dogs

GRAND FORKS — A sculpture honoring wartime military working dogs has been installed at Veterans Memorial Park, under the supervision of the Grand Forks Park District, at 24th Avenue South and 34th Street.

A formal ceremony is not planned to mark the addition to the park, said Jenelle Swenberger, project administrator with the park district, but the sculpture may be dedicated next spring or summer, along with a sculpture — in progress –

that honors service dogs. The bronze sculpture. titled "War Time Military Working Dog," was

installed Oct. 11 in the northwest section of the park. It was created by Brodin Studios Inc. of Kimball, Minnesota, which also produced the plaques that designate the military branch honored on each of the park's shelters.

sculpture, the dog faces the traditional U.S. battlefield cross memorial with combat boots and a helmet atop an upright rifle — which symbolizes the death of a soldier in

The concrete base and surrounding sidewalk were built by Opp Construction for \$21,200. The brick surrounding the base represents a \$9,400

in-kind donation from B&M Masonry, provided by Bob and Rose Bina.

The park district continues to fundraise for park maintenance, upkeep and for potential future amenities, Swenberger said.

Much of the fundraising for this project has been spearheaded by Col. Tom Saddler (retired, U.S. Air Force) and Lou Lombardi, veterans service officer, Grand Forks County, Swenberger said.

Suggestions for tributes or memorials to be added to the park are gathered and reviewed by a veterans committee that works with park district officials, she said.

"We get ideas from the veterans group and we make sure they are carried out in a way that's respectful," Swenberger

All the displays face, or will be planned to face, the Memorial Wall, a black granite wall that measures 6 feet high and 40 feet long. The wall is a historical display depicting images of military and political leaders and area service members, as well as U.S. military conflicts and armaments. It is surrounded by a series of five towering obelisks, representing branches of the U.S. military.
