QUALITY ENVIRONMENTAL ALLOCATES FUNDS TO TEN **MITIGATE PROJECTS** TO **NONPOINT** SOURCE **POLLUTION**

The North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality has allocated \$2.8 million in grant funding U.S. from the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Nonpoint Source Program to support ten projects aimed at mitigating nonpoint source pollution. The projects will focus on implementing best management practices, providing educational events, and offering technical and financial support to improve water quality across the state.

Among the funded projects included:

Wild Rice River PTMApp Prioritization Project Implement management practices in areas identified by the ND Prioritize, Target and Map application (PTMapp) in the Wild Rice River Watersheds in Sargeant County.
