The Board of County Commission-ers met on Friday, March 14, 2025 in the Commissioners room at the Kidder County Courthouse in Steele, ND. Commissioners Darrell Guthmiller, Tim C. Dronen, Nicholas Friez and Auditor Jean Schoenhard present. Also Pres-ent: Richard Paolinelli Steele Ozone & Kidder County Press, Dan P. Mittleider, Mike Rivinius Wold Engineering Chairman Guthmiller called the

water that would be released, where the water would go, and if the culverts downstream would handle the amount of water. Mittleider recommended the Commission write a letter to Stutsman County and to Stutsman County Water Resource Board about the County's concerns. Discussion was held on ir-rigation to control the water levels and US Fish & Wildlife needing the water to make better water for the wildlife. Mittleider did find out the railroad are not at their maximum footprint for the railroad tracks. Discussion held. Mittleider and
