Cleanup process will begin with a letter from Kathryn's office. Monetary help with public events should be specific and made to a vendor, not a cash donation.

Auditor: Text my gov provided information for a texting platform to send alerts and notifications of city happenings. The commissioners wanted to take the information and touch base at a later time. Terry asked for permission to approve local charity applications. She would bring updates to meetings for the commissioners. Justin motioned to grant Terry Macdonald permission to approve local charity applications for local Hazelton groups and Gloria seconded. All ayes.

Maintenance: Terry will place ads requesting sealed bids for the Allis-Chambers and mower. Scott requested to have Russell Macdonald help him with some of the street signs. The board was okay with Russell helping.

Water/Sewer: Sewer project by the restaurant was completed. And clean out put in on the main sewer line.

Old Business:
Moore Engineering – street project. Grant provided the phase II plan set for the street project. Phase I was for the chip sealing portion. He will bring bids for phase I & II to the June meeting. At the June meeting they will have a total project cost. Asphalt Preservation told Grant that they are in the area throughout the summer and can be flexible when they do the chip sealing.
