To encompass both communities, Regent will be a focal point Friday, June 12, and Mott will be the focal point Saturday, June 13, with activities throughout both communities starting Thursday afternoon, June 11, and continuing through Sunday, June 14.

The goal of all the events is to create a platform to reunite classmates, Aldinger said.

Everyone who attends is asked to register to create name tags and to help fund the events. The fee is \$75 per person or \$100 for two people.

Registration funds will go toward tents, tables and chairs, inflatables, bands, free games, fireworks and other activity expenses.

Highlights on Friday, June 12, in Regent include an opening ceremony at 8:30 a.m. to kickoff the reunion weekend with some school spirit. The opening ceremony will include tidbits from Regent School District No. 14, Mott School District No. 6 and Mott-Regent School District No. 1, with school songs from each, ending with a recorded pep band song.

A Regent landmark memory hunt in the form of a scavenger hunt will be just one of the ongoing events, along with Regent memory slideshows and bus rides along the Enchanted Highway. (See related story on the Enchanted Highway.)

A tractor, motorcycle and car show will be held from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday, and the Balyeats Band will perform at 12:15 p.m. A free noon meal, a parade at 5 p.m. and the Country Classic Band at 5:30 p.m., followed by DJ music, are other

highlights on Friday in Regent. In-between are opportunities for socializing, school tours, visits to the museum, a cornhole tournament, mini golf, kids activities and other events, including a "Staff Meeting" at the Enchanted Castle at 10:30 a.m. for those who once worked at the school.

On Sunday, June 14, a trap and skeet shoot will be held at the Cannonball Clay Dusters shooting range from noon to 5 p.m.

In Mott on Saturday, June 13, the Classics on Wheels Car Show will be held from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and the craft and vendor street fair with nearly 30 vendors will be from 10:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. A polka band, the "Queen City Band," will entertain from noon to 2 p.m.

A special event is the Cafe Concert Revisited, with local talent performing at 2 p.m. similar to the school's annual Cafe Concert.

A salute to the country's 250th anniversary, a tribute to the area veterans and daytime fireworks are set for 5 p.m.

At 8:30 p.m., a street dance will begin with

live music by Unleashed, whose lead vocalist is a Mott native. Fireworks at 10 p.m. will close the evening's activities.

Another highlight will be an all-school reunion golf scramble at noon Friday, June 12, at the Mott Country Club. Registration starts at 10:30 a.m. for the nine-hole, four person scramble.

In-between, reunion opportunities abound, and a historical video presentation will be shown. An escape room experience, kids activities and school tours are also on the agenda in Mott.

On Sunday, both communities are planning church services, with Mott hosting an all-community country gospel service with the Stealin' Country Band at the Mott armory at 10 a.m.

In Regent, the Country Church in the museum will have music by Cliff Walter from 11 a.m. to noon.

**MOTT-REGENT SCHOOL HISTORY THROUGH THE YEARS**

**Mott School District**

In 1907, country schools from four townships consolidated to form the Mott Public School District No. 6. Mott opened its first school in the spring of 1907. A wood-framed structure was built in north Mott that fall.

In 1911, a new concrete and brick school was built for \$50,000 on a hill in east Mott.

In 1929, the new high school opened, named Mott Lincoln High School because its dedication ceremony was held on Feb. 12, 1930.

The first high school basketball game was played in the new Mott National Guard Armory on Dec. 16, 1960.

**Regent School District**

The first school in Regent was established in 1910 in a one-room rural school building moved from Edton.

In 1912, the hill on the outskirts of town was

chosen for a new four-room brick school. It was ready to use in 1913.

In January 1924, the \$15,000 addition to the older brick building was completed.

In 1958, voters approved a \$127,000 bond issue to build a new high school building. Enrollment that year was 289 students in the district.

**Mott-Regent School District**

On July 1, 2001, the Mott School District No. 6 and the Regent School District No. 14 consolidated to form the Mott-Regent School District No. 1. Regent continued to have an elementary school, with the junior high and high school in Mott.

Since May 2009, the Regent school has been closed.
