Mandan Police Report

The Mandan Police Department responded to 76 cases June 29 through July 5.

The MPD responded to the following cases on Monday, June 29: found property; harassing phone call/letter/electronic communication; disorderly conduct; child neglect and abuse-violent-simple assault; disorderly conduct; found property; destruction/damage/vandalism of property/criminal mischief; harassing phone call/letter/electronic communication; drug/narcotic violations, drove without liability insurance, expired registration, violation of driver license restrictions, stop sign violation; burglar/break and entering; disorderly conduct; all other larceny-theft; animal bite, child neglect and abuse non-violent; domestic dispute; disorderly conduct.

The MPD responded to the following cases on Tuesday, June 30: detox, trespass of real property; disorderly conduct, criminal trespass; unlawful to accumulate junk, junk vehicles, trash and rubbish (arrest); all other larceny-theft; commitment; assist other agency; motor vehicle accident; all other larceny-theft; harassment; all other larceny-theft; terrorizing, domestic dispute; all other larceny-theft; missing person/attempt to locate; driving with suspended license.

NEW SALEM STREET CLOSURES

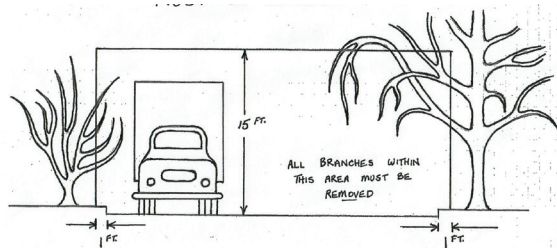
