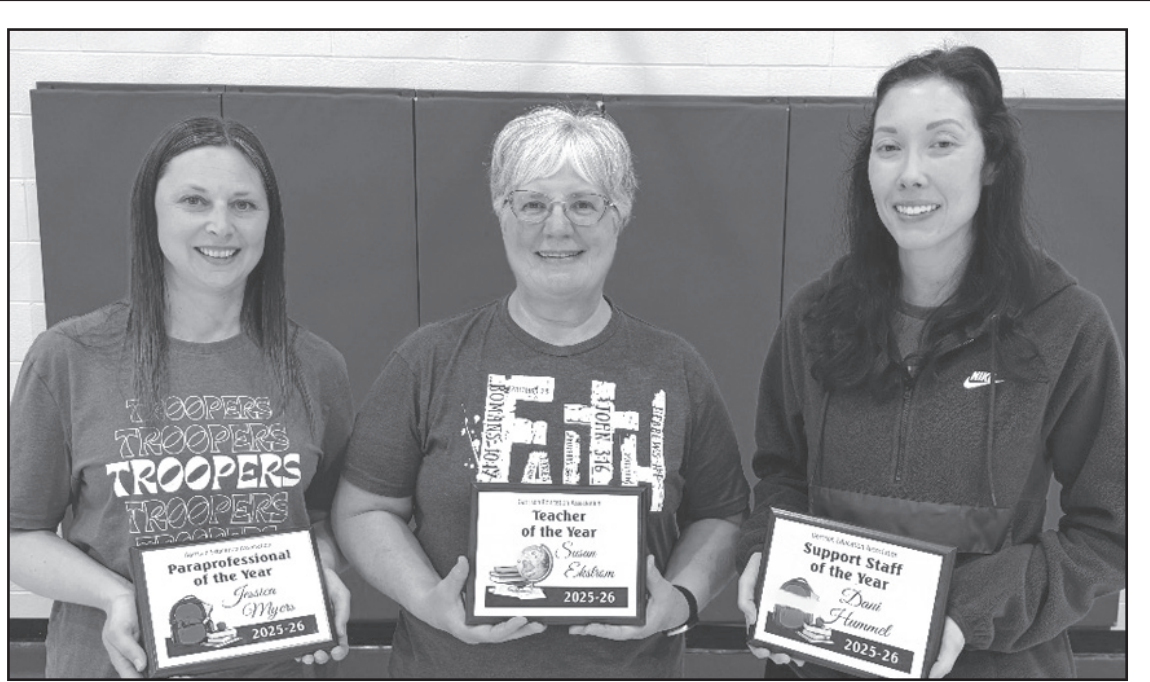

# City Council Round Up

### Douglas

The Douglas City Council met on April 13. Mayor Jim Porter called the meeting to order.

Discussion was held about putting the Old Ballfield Addition up for sale for a minimum bid of \$20,000.

Notices went in the McLean County Independent and the Minot Daily News.

Sealed bids can be sent to the City of Douglas, 41 2nd Ave. SW, Douglas, ND 58735. Payment for the winning bid must be paid within 10 days. The bids will be opened at the June 17 City Council Meeting.

The project to build up the east end lagoon, excavation and gravel for the new access to the City R.V. Park, installation of a new curb stop and new hydrants were motioned and passed by the council. The bid of \$27,300 from Hanson's Excavation was accepted and will be paid out of the Municipal Infrastructure Fund.

Those present at the meeting were Mayor Porter, Dylan Nerum, Tabitha Carlson, Evan Reimer and Dusty Zuck.

The next Douglas City Council meeting will be on May 5 at 7 p.m.

### Benedict

The Benedict City Council

meeting was called to order on April 13 by Mayor Randy Tomlinson.

A Snow Removal contract was approved by the council to hire J. Crum for \$5,000 for the entire season, with Crum providing his own equipment and will have use of the city shop for storage and maintenance. The motion passed unanimously, with Crum abstaining from voting.

The council will apply for charitable gaming funds from the Velva Volunteer Fire Department in the amount of \$2,395 to assist with the cost of the 2026 McLean County Sheriff's contract.

The council will also apply for charitable gaming funds from the Aggies Foundation for \$5,000 to assist with the snow removal costs.

### Makoti
