Stanley's varsity boys' basketball team had a busy week with three games on their schedule. They traveled to Watford City on Tuesday, Jan. 6, losing the game by a score of 34 to 78. On Friday, Jan. 9, they hosted Standing Rock, losing by a score of 46 to 63. On Saturday, Jan. 10 they were in Dickinson, facing the Trinity Titans, losing by a score of 22 to 63.

Stanley vs. Watford City

The Blue Jays were on the road on Tuesday, Jan. 6 to face the Watford City Wolves. The Wolves held a seven point lead at the end of the first quarter, extending their lead to 19 at the half on their way to the 78 to 34 win.

As a team, Stanley made 10 of their 25 two point and 3 of their 17 three point attempts. They converted 5 of their 12 free throws. That compared to 22 of 35 two point, 9 of 23 three point and 7 of 12 free throw attempts for Watford City.
