Notice To The Public

The Board of County Commissioners again appeals to the public for cooperation in observing LOAD LIMIT REGULATIONS on County Roads. Owing to the present conditions of the roads it is absolutely necessary to observe these restrictions if roads are to be saved this Spring:

SINGLE AXLE – 300 pounds per inch width of tire, plus 2,000 pounds, not to exceed 12,000 pounds

TANDEM AXLE – 300 pound per inch width of tires, not exceed 12,000 pounds per axle

NOT TO EXCEED 6 TONS PER AXLE.

In case road restrictions are not observed it will be necessary to enforce the law regarding such restrictions.

County Planning & Zoning Meeting

February 3, 2026

The Sheridan County Planning & Zoning board met at 10:30 a.m. County Planning & Zoning members present were: Kendon Faul, Sandra Felchle, Byron Belile, Brian Galvin, Karen Kenschak. Others present were: Shannon Dieterle and Roddy Schilling, County Commissioners and Scott Baier, McClusky City resident. Absent: Gerald Spear and Michael Axt

Chairman Faul called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meeting was sent out by mail and email. It was moved by County P & Z Commissioner Byron Belile to approve the minutes as is, seconded by County P & Z Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Belile – yes, Felchle – yes, Galvin – yes, Kenschak – yes Motion carried.

Faul inquired if anymore data center P & Z policies or info has been gathered. Felchle reported that Ladd Erickson, States Attorney, informed the County Commissioners that the County P & Z board follow the ND Public Service Commissioner rules for now being they are more stringent. Also the County Commissioners are the only ones that can set a moratorium on anything, not the P & Z board being the P & Z board members are not elected by the public. It was moved by County P & Z Commissioner Belile to table the moratorium on data centers coming into the County for now unless the County Commissioners see fit otherwise, seconded by County P & Z Commissioner Kenschak. Upon roll call vote – Belile – yes, Kenschak – yes, Galvin – yes, Felchle – yes Motion carried.

Faul stated the Conditional Use hearing held today is with Fisher Sand & Gravel Co, Dickinson to mine gravel out property owned by Michael Faul in the SE4 19-149-75. (Former gravel pit that Ralph Volson crushed gravel in). Vent Wallace, Manager for Fisher Sand & Gravel, Dickinson was present by zoom call for any questions. It was moved by County P & Z Commissioner Belile to approve the conditional permit to Fisher Sand & Gravel Co., at stated property above to crush gravel for state highway 52 project upgrade, seconded by County P & Z Commissioner Galvin. Upon roll call vote – Belile – yes, Galvin – yes, Kenschak – yes, Felchle – yes Motion carried.

County P & Z Commissioner Kenschak stated Sheldon Frueh may be interested in being on the County P & Z board if Michael Axt is no longer interested being on the County P & Z board due to he has not attended previous meetings.

It was moved by County P & Z Commissioner Belile to adjourn the meeting, seconded by County P & Z Commissioner Galvin. All voting “Aye” the motion carried.

County Park Commissioners Meeting

The Board of County Park Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. as set. County Park Commissioners present were Tina Majors, Amanda Bott, Shannon Dieterle, Sandra Felchle and Roddy Schilling. Others present were: Samantha Roubal, County Park Manager and Scott Baier, McClusky City resident

Majors called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meeting was sent by mail and email. It was moved by County Park Commissioner Felchle to approve the minutes as is, seconded by County Park Commissioner Bott. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Bott – yes, Dieterle – yes, Schilling – yes, Majors – yes Motion carried.

The Auditor reported the NDIRF agent replied back on if commercial playground equipment has to be placed at Hoffer Lake or if it doesn't matter. The agent reported that NDIRF can't dictate what kind of playground equipment to purchase or the base it is set on. The GDCD grant is available again with closing date of March 2nd.

Bott reported that she contacted the Bureau of Reclamation to get approval for installing playground equipment and extra sand on former #3 campsite and that the Bureau needs more details where sand is coming from, etc. in order to approve. Bott shared the Lifetime brand of Double Adventure Tower with Monkey Bars playground set as a suggestion for playground equipment to be installed thru Amazon in the amount of \$4,500.00. Extra benches near the playground would be good to install also if extra funds are available or edging to keep sand from spreading.

Majors called Underwood Farm Supply for info on riding lawn mowers with no response back and will keep trying.

Roubal updated on the vandalism event at Hoffer Lake with students tearing up the sod. Three students will be spending time spreading out the ruts this spring for Roubal. A Sheriff's report has been officially filed. The water pipes will be re-evaluated in the spring to see if damaged. The beaver control is still ongoing. The beaver hut is located in the wall of the canal.

Felchle reported there was an emergency disaster table top meeting last week and the 4-H building at Hoffer Lake was identified as an emergency shelter place in case a disaster was happening in the City of McClusky. Wi-fi was in question to be able to communicate with emergency services and could be brought in by WRT at no cost unless when turned on remotely one month or so at a time then monthly cost at \$65 per mth. on up. The County Agent will be contacted to see if wi-fi should also be connected at the Livestock building. It was moved by County Park Commissioner Felchle to contact WRT to install wi-fi in the 4-H building at Hoffer Lake, seconded by County Park Commissioner Dieterle. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Dieterle – yes, Schilling – yes, Bott – yes, Majors – yes Motion carried.

The next meeting will be March 3, at 8:30 a.m. The meeting adjourned.

Tracy Stein, Deputy Auditor, met with the board to report the Safety employees (Sheriff's Office) NDPERS retirement went up to 19.26% and regular employees are at 16.26% as of January 1st 2026.

Connie Werth, County Treasurer, met with the board to report the other 3 CD's are up for renewal with Bravera, Inc., McClusky. The interest rates are 4 mths at 3.8% and 11 mths. at 3.6%. It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to rewrite all 3 CD's to 11 mths. at 3.6% interest, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling- yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

The Auditor reported the 5 year lease for Canon copy machine is up. Advanced Business Solutions, Bismarck, has a Ricoh copier machine that includes a new folding paper option along with the 3 hole punch and staple options that the old copier had. It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to approve a 5 year lease with Advanced Business Methods for a Ricoh copier machine in the amount of \$306.75 per mth., seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

Trent Naser, Sheriff, met with the board to present his annual crime and civil calls report for 2025 to review. Discussion of possibly not having a States Attorney in the next year was considered and the Auditor was instructed to contact Aaron at the NDACo for input. Naser also reported the police service agreement with McClusky City is up for renewal. A 3% increase on the police service

agreement will be sent to McClusky City for approval.

The Auditor was instructed to contact General Contractors, Carrington, to get new estimates on repairing the exterior walls of the Courthouse and to contact the Bank of ND on applying for the low interest loan for the project also.

Lea Mittleider, County Agent, met with the board to request sharing 1/2 of the cost of a yearly online livestock judging subscription of \$150 out of her County Agent programming line budget. The board agreed to allow the \$150 to be paid out of the County Agent programing budget. Discussion of having wi-fi available at the livestock building that can be turned off when needed esp. if the 4-H building will have it anyway would be helpful. In January, Mittleider had beef quality assurance training, Advisory Board meeting with County Agents around the state. Mittleider also attended NDSU Feedlot School at Carrington Research Center and is helping with the County 4-H livestock judging.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to hire Seth Galvin, Goodrich, at \$35.00 per mowing and trimming around the Sheriff's storage building in Goodrich, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

The Auditor reported a building permit was issued to Rodrigue/Flatlie Family Trust to construct a 30'x 34' garage located at the NE4 20-147-75.

Byron Belile, Road Foreman, met with the board to discuss purchasing LED lights online to be installed on motorgraders by the road crew for more safety. The new Motorgraders have different cutting edges then the older models. Kevin Vietz will start the CDL training with the road crew this month. The NDACo tractor lease program was reviewed with Byron Belile. It was moved by County Commissioner Schilling to approve a 80-135 hp JD tractor for \$22.50 per hr for 8 mths. and 135-195 hp JD tractor for \$28.50 for 12 mths, seconded by County Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Schilling – yes, Felchle – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

A landowner in the Goodrich area had sent in a written note that he was very pleased with the bladework in the Goodrich area.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.


