Meeting was called to order by Dennis Rice at 2:00pm. Members Present: Dennis Rice, Lori Eagon, Hope Mastel. Members Remote: Molly Lyson. Members Absent: Shannon Minerich. Others Present: Kirby Baier, David Septon. Pledge of Allegiance: The pledge of allegiance was led by Kirby Baier. Agenda: Lori Eagon made a motion to approve the agenda with additions to

new business, Hope Mastel seconded, all in favor, motion carried. Public Comment: Introductions were made with David Septon. Minutes: March 12th, 2026, regular board meeting minutes were read. Hope Mastel made a motion to approve the minutes, Lori Eagon seconded, all in favor, motion carried. Financial Report: District accounts were presented to the board. Hope Mastel made a motion to approve the presented bills, Molly Lyson seconded, all in favor, motion carried. Administrators Report: Kirby Baier updated the board on the REAP Meeting, Library Board Meeting, and Infinite Campus. Lena Kennel updated the board on the school monthly calendar and NDSBMCP. New Business: Hope Mastel made a motion to hire Stacy Rice for janitorial duties and have Dennis Rice continue maintenance duties, Molly Lyson seconded, all in favor, motion carried. Molly Lyson made a motion to accept Tracy Teigen's resignation from her teaching position, Lori Eagon seconded, all in favor, motion carried. The roof above the gym was discussed and will be checked for possible leaks. Old Business: Teacher contracts for the 2026-2027 school year were discussed. Obsolete equipment was discussed. Dennis Rice updated the board on gravel for the parking lot and furnace maintenance. Public Comment: None. 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April 1, 2026 Regular Meeting Slope County Commission

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 A.M. by Chairman Ouradnik with Commissioners Sonsalla and Teske present. Commissioner Teske presented a motion to approve the minutes of the March meeting as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sonsalla and passed with all in favor. Erika Stanley met with the commissioners with a proposal to redo the cop car that sits in Amidon. The proposed cost is \$25,000. She is working with the City of Amidon and possibly looking at some kind of donations. Kirby Baier, Slope County Superintendent of Schools, met with the commissioners to give them an update on the Marmarth School 4-day school week waiver and state testing. A discussion was held via telephone with Kris Schwab of Core Facility Solutions concerning updating the generator to possibly run the entire courthouse and applying for the proposed cost of \$360,000 through the Court Facilities Improvement Grant. Commissioner Teske presented a motion to apply for the court facilities grant for an updated generator. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sonsalla and passed with all in favor. Nathan Miller, Slope County Road Foreman, met with the commissioners to present gravel requests from Peaceful Valley Township and Bucklin Township. Commissioner Teske presented a

motion to provide the requested gravel to Peaceful Valley and Bucklin Townships at no charge. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ouradnik and passed with all in favor. Also discussed were possible projects to utilize the flex funding received from the State of North Dakota. Discussion was held on flood plain management zoning. Since the State's Attorney was not available due to a family emergency, discussion will be held at a later date. Richard Frederick, Slope County Emergency Manager, met with the commissioner to discuss the generator power at the courthouse. Also discussed were fire restrictions and waiting to implement them.
