An interesting part of history is genealogy. Genealogy isn't just a hobby; it's a profound exploration of who we are and where we come from. By delving into our family's past, we gain a better understanding of ourselves, our culture, and our place in history. It's a journey that connects us to our roots, enriches our lives, and leaves a lasting legacy for future generations.

In 2014 a survey was conducted, 67% said that knowing their family

history has made them feel wiser as a person. 72% said it helped them be closer to older relatives. 52% said they discovered ancestors they had not known about. When studying the history of my family I found a relative who was hanged as a witch, another who was captured by Indians and lived with them for five years. Also found relationship with noted people such as Laura Ingalls Wilder's husband.
