Dorothy Becker inquired about the CD at Dacotah Bank created as loan collateral for Rae's Boutique. Ferderer informed the board the owner does not wish to continue with the program.

To be eligible for Lifeline assistance, an applicant or subscriber, one of their dependents or their household must participate in one or more of the following programs: Federal Public Housing Assistance, Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Veteran's Pension and Survivor's Benefit Program. Individuals whose total household income is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are also eligible for Lifeline assistance. Additional Tribal Lifeline and Tribal Link Up support is available to those qualifying individuals living on Tribal Lands. Tribal Lifeline/Link Up provides for additional service discounts, and in addition to the previously cited programs, for those individuals residing on Federally Recognized Tribal Lands, participating in the BIA General Assistance program, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), Head Start or Tribal TTANF qualifies them for this support. Only eligible consumers may enroll in the Lifeline program. Lifeline applicants must present documentation demonstrating eligibility either through participation in one of the qualifying federal assistance programs or through income-based means. Lifeline recipients are required to recertify their eligibility every year. The Lifeline program is limited to one benefit per household, consisting of either wireline, wireless, or Internet service. Lifeline is a government benefit program and consumers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain the benefit can be punished by fine or imprisonment or can be barred from the program.
