Update on the New Water Meters was given. 16 new meters have been installed for the month of December. There are only 5 left to be installed. Which will be installed this coming week. The new water meters have been very impressive detecting leaks from sinks and toilets within 3 hours or less. Gives reports on temperatures of area the meter is at and water coming into the meter.
Diamond Mapping Software has been set up on our computer system for 30-day free trial. ND Rural Water mapped out our water and sewer lines last summer. This program will allow us to keep track of all work, special notes done on these items along with water meters information. This sys-

tem will cost the city only \$11.00 per month. Tony Zenker made a motion to approve the cost of the software. Patrick Diehl seconded, all council members voting "aye" and motion carried.
Carson Police Report sent from Jennifer Wells was red to the council.
