organizational skills, and kids can be very creative when playing. Games like chess are a great way to decrease screen time and connect with friends face to face.”

Wolf, who lives in Bismarck, champions the game across the state. A three-time state chess champion, he was inducted into the North Dakota Chess Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

“I’ve been playing since I was probably 6 or 7 years old, because I had three older brothers that played and my dad played,” he says.

After chaperoning some students at the State Scholastic Chess Tournament for K-12 students in 1990, he entered the open state tournament the next month.

Another tournament prompted him to start

sharing his skills with students.

“My son won the state high school tournament his freshman year and played in a national tournament. And when he played in that, I saw how far behind the North Dakota students were. So, the very next year, I started running chess camps in the summertime. ... That’s what got me started is wanting to improve the chess in North Dakota,” Wolf says.

Now, he travels to schools across the state to share his passion for the game.

During his second visit to the Elgin-New Leipzig Elementary School, he explains the chessboard, how each piece can move or attack and the basic principles, then students start

playing.

“They get a chance to play and ask questions while they’re playing,” he says.

“Some of the benefits are when kids start to grasp what’s going on, and they get some of those ‘aha’ moments. It helps them self regulate. It helps them learn to focus,” he says. “When we learn fundamental ideas, like in basketball or football or volleyball, there are certain things that you want to do that’ll help you be more successful.”

“When I go out to schools, I see the excitement and the focus when I’m presenting,” Wolf says. “Once they start playing, they realize how much fun it can be and and you don’t have to be good to enjoy playing, as long as you can find somebody to play with that is around your level. You can have a lot of fun playing the game.”

“If anybody learns the fundamentals, anybody can play a reasonably decent game of chess,” Wolf says. And the secret to being a good player?

“Just playing and being willing to play, not being afraid to lose,” he says.

Wolf is willing to share more with those interested in pursuing the game, including sharing information about sites such as chess.com or chesskid.com.

at a time and offer her community delicious foods with simple ingredients. “It’s a way to bring people together, slow down, and reconnect with where your food comes from,” she says.

The farm stand is currently operating on a winter schedule and Jochim is only accepting pre-orders to ensure quality. “I didn’t want all of my stuff out there in the cold months because I want to offer the best goods I can,” she explains.

Each month, Jochim carefully curates a pre-order menu featuring a variety of baked goods. Sourdough loaves, muffins, coffee cakes, and cinnamon rolls are staples of the stand. Her recipes are a blend of cherished hand-me-downs, original creations, and favorites she has discovered and grown to love.

“We offer comfort, quality, and consistency,” says Jochim. “From homemade sourdough and baked goods to farm-fresh eggs and seasonal offerings, everything is made or sourced with intention. We focus on simple ingredients and traditional methods that fit naturally into everyday family life,” she added.

During the spring and fall months, the Jochim Farm Stand will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Central Time, Saturday and Sundays. It is a fully functioning

self-serve stand with a lock box for payment. Eggs can be ordered through Jochim or be found in the mini fridge at the Farm Stand during operating hours in the spring and fall.
