Velva City Commission meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Commission President Mike Schreiner. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll Call: Mike Schreiner – Commission President, Street/Finance; Dave Keller – Vice President, Police Commissioner (including Cemetery oversight); Mary Liz Davis – Police/Finance Commissioner; Ben Zietz – Water/Sewer Commissioner; Gene Jenson– Commissioner of Streets/

Improvements (including Cemetery oversight); Kerry Wyche– City Deputy Auditor; Emma Lavachek, Alan Walter, Brian Julius – Ackerman-Estvold Engineering and Heather Tudor – Velva Area Voice.

Motion by Davis/Keller to approve the minutes from the November 18, 2024 regular meeting. Roll Call: All-aye; motion carried.

PAYROLL & BILLS: Davis/Zietz made a motion to approve the bills paid and bills to be paid in the amount of \$63,384.41 and Payroll for \$39,772.48. Roll Call: All-aye; motion carried. Reports of Officers, Boards, Committees Commissioner Keller: Keller stated that some residents complained that the signs for the speed bump (Central Ave. E) and no Jake brakes (on Hwy 52) were too small. Keller also mentioned he has seen coyotes running through his yard. Schriener suggested Keller to call the Game & Fish Department.

Commissioner Davis: Davis saw a trailer parked on the street that was not hooked up to a vehicle (Ordinance violation). The owner was contacted and fixed the issue.

Commissioner Zietz: Zietz received quotes from several places selling dump trailers to haul mowers, skid steers, etc. Jenson/Zietz made a motion allocating \$15,000.00 towards the purchase of a dump trailer. All ayes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Jenson: Jenson had nothing to discuss.

Engineer's Report: Alan Walter informed the Commission this would be his last meeting. Walter stated bids for the 41-bridge project were opened Dec. 6, 2024. No bids were turned in for the project. The plan is to redo the bridge and reshape the river to handle

extra water. Walter stated he does not have a date when the bridge project will be completed, but the entire project will be finished by 2030. Emma Lavachek stated she was surprised Velva did not receive a bridge bid. Lavachek discussed the Master Lift Sation reimbursements and when Velva would receive repayment.
