# **Dickey County Commission Minutes**

#### Commissioner Meeting March 19, 2024

Chair Jerry Walsh called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Commissioners John Hokana, Brandon Carlson, and Kacey Holm were also present. Auditor Sheppard was also present. The media was not present. Recited was the Pledge of Allegiance. Resident Cindy Bagley was present, Clerk of Court Andi Schimke and Health District employee Allyssa Moch were present via electronic means. Agenda additions

McIntosh County resolution Holm made a motion to approve the minutes from March 5th with corrections.

Carlson seconded. Motion carried. Attorney Administrative States Assistant Holly Hokana, Dickey County Sheriff's office personnel, and States Attorney Kim Radermacher joined via electronic means at 9:09.

Hokana made a motion to approve the vouchers. Holm seconded. There was a discussion on the cost of prison boarding included in the vouchers. Roll call was unanimous. Motion carried.

Carlson made a motion to approve the financials from February 2024. Holm seconded. Roll call was unanimous. Motion carried.

Carlson discussed his conversations with the Ludden Sportsman's Club concerning putting a picnic area at the new boat landing on Dakota Lake one mile south of the old Riverside property on Highway 1 on the west side. They are requesting assistance from Dickey County to pour the cement slab for a picnic shelter at the landing. The approximate cost is \$2,000. Carlson has been assisting Administrative Assistant Amv Mittleider to apply for a grant to assist with the project and needs approval from the Commission. Carlson made a motion to authorize Mittleider to apply for the grant for the project. Hokana seconded. Roll call was unanimous. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented two advertisements for publication in the newspaper, for the sale of a 2010 Chrvsler Town and Country van and the sale of Lot 12 Block 31, First Addition, City of Ellendale. Carlson made a motion to approve the advertisements as presented and the placement in the newspaper. Holm seconded. Motion carried.

Bagley discussed with the Commission research she had done concerning jail buildings in other counties. Bagley suggested she investigate options for Dickey County. The Commission stated that Bagley could gather the information, but there were no guarantees of further action

Sheriff Chris Estes, County Agent Breana Kiser, Family and Community Wellness Agent Danielle Dinger, and Administrative Assistant Monica Pakonen joined the meeting at 9:50.

Kiser and Dinger introduced Pakonen as the new administrative assistant in the County Agent's office.

Radermacher discussed with the Commission the resolution McIntosh County is requesting Dickey County to sign, which would allow Radermacher to run as States Attorney for McIntosh County in the June 11th Primary. The past States Attorney is no longer with the county and there is no one else qualified to run for the position. Radermacher stated that there would not be any conflict with dates, as their Commission

and Radermacher did not know what the plan was that McIntosh County had developed. The concern is that Dickey County residents do not lose any service because of making this change. Carlson made a motion to sign the resolution. Holm seconded. Until clarification on the proposal is received, the motion was placed on hold.

Hokana made a motion to open the abatement hearing. Holm seconded. Motion carried.

Flaherty presented six property owners that have filed homestead credit applications for the tax years of 2022 and 2023. Flaherty also presented two residents applying for disabled veteran credit for 2023. All qualify according to the North Dakota Century Code. Holm made a motion to approve the applications. Carlson seconded. Roll call was unanimous. Motion carried.

Carlson made a motion to close the abatement hearing. Holm seconded. Motion carried.

Flaherty informed the Commission that Deputy Tax Director Nicole Kempf has accepted the position of Ellendale Citv Auditor, with the probable end date with Dickey County on April 30th. The posting of this job opening will be in the Times Leader for the March 21st and March 28th newspapers.

Discussion followed concerning contracts with Vanguard to complete programming for our property assessment information to be available online. Radermacher stated she has concerns with the presented contracts and has not discussed with the Vanguard contact about any changes. Radermacher will work with Vanguard to finalize the contracts.

Sheppard discussed the setting of polling locations in Dickey County for the 2024 Primary and General elections. Discussion included the limited options in the cities of Oakes and Ellendale, Hokana made a motion to continue to have the Oakes Vote Center at the Oakes Armory. Carlson seconded. Motion carried. Holm made a motion to have the Ellendale Vote Center at the all-purpose room at the Ellendale Church of the Nazarene. Carlson seconded. Motion carried.

KLJ Engineer Bryan Tykwinski, DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell, and Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 10:45.

The meeting went into recess at 10:45 and returned at 10:50.

Discussion followed concerning the location for a storage building for the Sheriff's office, Health District, and the Highway Department. The amount in the 2024 budget is not enough to complete a building, but the project could begin. The locations discussed were to add on to the current weed board building or purchase land across the road from the building, which has a partial building on the property that could be available for sale. The owner of the property has stated that the land could be available for sale. Walsh made a motion to offer \$25,000 to Hans Gruner to purchase the property across the road from the weed board building. Holm seconded Boll call was unanimous. Motion carried. Radermacher will compile a purchase agreement that Chair Walsh will sign and present to the owner. Hagen stated the road staff has been

Excess Mill Levy Notice of Special Election Notice is Hereby Given that on April 30 2024 at the home of Mike Beethe in the Township of Yorktown, County Dickey an election will be held in which the fol lowing question shall be submitted to the electors of Yorktown Township. Shall Yorktown Township levy taxes for a five year period commencing in 2024, which shall exceed the legal limit by \$19,566 so that the taxes levied instead of \$19,571, which is the limit authority by law, shall be \$39,131 () Yes or () No

Be it known that the total income of Yorktown Township from the first day of January 2023, to the last day of De cember 2023 was \$44,762 and the tota warrants issued for said period amount ed to \$56,216 resulting to a deficit for said period of \$11,454.

Be it further known that the expected expenditures for each year of a five year period commencing in 2024 are roughly equivalent to \$38,825 spent in 2022

Be it further known that the current tax levy of 18 mills which produced \$19,571 in income in 2023 is the legal maximum but that a 100 percent excess is autho rized for a five year period. If 60 percent of the qualified electors shall approve the above stated guestion, the levy shall be increased to be the amoun of 36 mills upon each dollar of taxable evaluation which increase would have produced \$19.566 in additional income at 2023 valuations.
