PUBLIC INPUT MEETING

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is hosting a public input meeting Monday, October 21, from 5 to 7 p.m. MDT to discuss proposed improvements to Chateau Road in Medora.

The meeting will be held at the Medora Community Center in the Roosevelt Room, 465 Pacific Ave, Medora, ND. The meeting will be an open house format with a formal presentation at 5:30 p.m.

The project consists of reconstruction of Chateau Road from Pacific Avenue (I-94 Business Loop) to the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation Burning Hills Amphitheater.

Representatives from the NDDOT and KLJ Engineering will be on hand to answer questions and discuss concerns.

A pre-recorded presentation and other materials will be available on the NDDOT website at www.dot.nd.gov/public-input.

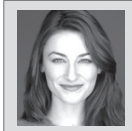
