Tax exemption paperwork was finished by Aaron. Katie has overlooked the paperwork and is excited for the program. Fixen motioned to approve Resolution 2024-01: RESOLUTION 2024-01

WHEREAS, Section 57-02-08(35) of the North Dakota Century Code provides for the exemption of up to one hundred fifty thousand dollars of the True and Full value of all new singlefamily and condominium and townhouse residential property, exclusive of the land on which it is situated, from taxation for the two taxable years after the taxable year in which construction is completed and the residence is owned and occupied for the first time if all of certain enumerated conditions are met; and

WHEREAS, the exemption is to be implemented by resolution of the City Governing Body;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Alexander, North Dakota, deems it to be in the best interests of the City to implement the authority granted in order to provide incentive for the construction of new dwelling units creating commerce in the local community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Alexander that up to one hundred fifty thousand dollars of the True and Full value of all new single-family and condominium and townhouse residential property, exclusive of the land on which it is situated, including modular housing as defined in the current Alexander Zoning Ordinance that is permanently attached to a foundation as required by the Alexander Building Codes; and excluding property located in a Tax Increment Funding District, or, during the same time, receiving exemption from any other item under NDCC 57-02-08, shall be exempt from taxation for the first two taxable years after the taxable year in which construction is completed and the residence is "owner occupied" for the first time if the following conditions are met:

a) Special assessments and taxes on the property upon which the residence is situated are not

b) The owner will need to contact the County Recorder to advise when construction is completed. Failure to do so will result in the loss of the exemption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be effective until it is rescinded by the City Council of the City of Alexander. Application forms shall be available at the city auditor's office. Approval of all applications shall be acted upon by the City Council of the City of Alexander.

This resolution was adopted and approved by the City Council of the City of Alexander at its regular meeting on April 3rd, 2024.
