

Superintendent Benson provided updates for Activity Director Jangula. The NDHSAA is considering modifications to the transfer rules that are currently in place. Underwood will have wrestling this year through a cooperative agreement with Velva. Underwood will not be starting an Esports program this year due to the lack of adult supervision when the students are at home. We prefer to wait until we have our own Esports lab in the school where a coach will be present when the students are competing.
