VELVA CITY COMMISSION MEETING **NOVEMBER 17, 2025** VELVA CITY HALL

The Velva City Commission met October 21 at 7:00 p.m. Commissioners Schreiner, Keller, Davis and Zietz were in attendance, with Jenson's absence being unanimously approved due to an obligation for training with the Velva Ambulance. Also present: Jenny Johns, Emma Lavachek, Heather Tudor (VAV) and Deputy Dave Dewanz. Minutes from the October 20 regular meeting was approved.

Bills totaling \$34,427.04 (Ackerman 582.50, Acme 197.58, Am. Commission President Schreiner reviewed the Police Report. Deputy Dewanz added that the McHenry County Sheriff's Department will hold a training session on December 11, hosting several officers from surrounding jurisdictions.

Schreiner presented the list of foreclosed property for sale, with a particular parcel of land that runs adjacent to the city's transmission line. Johns stated that Jemtrud expressed interest in the property due to its logistics, and asked if the commission would be interested in bidding on it. Keller moved seconded by Davis to bid on the property, with a maximum bid of \$5,000; and to designate Assessor Bourdeau as the city's bidder/ representative. R/C: All ayes. M/c.


Johns asked if the city would be interested in a co-op senior from the school that would be willing and able to help with Auditor, Assessor and Public Works tasks during the second semester of school. Johns stated the 2026 budget would need to be amended to include the student's wages up to \$2,500 out of the water fund.

Davis moved, seconded by Keller, to amend the 2026 budget to include wages out of the water fund for a coop student from January to May. R/C: All ayes. M/c. Mary Liz Davis had no business to discuss. Dave Keller asked about the sale of the Lariat. Ben Zietz had no business to discuss. Gene Jenson was unable to attend due to ambulance/CPR requirements.

Engineer Lavachek Emma (Ackerman-Estvold) submitted the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) grant application to the state, which may provide low-interest financing for future water and sewer improvements

Auditor Jenny Johns presented the finalized list of unpaid nuisance abatement fees and penalties submitted to the County per the deadline. Johns asked that the commission consider an increase to the current late fee on the utility bills. The current fee is \$5/ month; however, this penalty does not dissuade some residents from paying their bill late. Johns asked for the commission to increase the late fee to 10% per billing cycle, as well as, increasing the "re-connection of curb/ stop fee" to \$100, instead of \$25. Davis moved, seconded by Zietz, to increase the utility bill penalties from \$5 to 10% and to increase the reconnection fee to \$100 from \$25. R/C: All ayes. M/c. 12/04/2025

He furthered his education attending the North Dakota State School of Science at Wahpeton and graduated in 1985 with an Associate Degree in Applied Science and Industrial Electronic and Instrumentation Technology. He also graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business from Moorhead State University in 1991.
