REGULAR ANNUAL SCHOOL BOARD MEETING LINTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 36 LINTON ND JULY 21, 2025

Regular meeting was called to order by President Jennifer Vetter at 5:58 P.M. Board members present: Bryce Weber, Corey Vetter, Sara Jahner, and Rick Hulm. Also present were Supt. Schirado, Business Manager Marcia King, Elem. Prin. Huber, Alex Jangula, Brayden Byers, and Melissa Wolf-Tveito.

Amended agenda to include teacher resignation under item M. Extra-curricular resignation/teacher resignation. It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mr. Hulm to approve the amended agenda. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Jahner and seconded by Mr. Vetter to approve the regular minutes of the June 23rd meeting. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to approve the bills. Motion carried.

The financial reports were reviewed by the board.

Business Manager King presented and explained the annual reports which included the activity account report and revenue and expenditure budget report. Mrs. King presented and explained the Business Manager's annual report and the annual financial report for publication. It was moved by Mrs. Jahner and seconded by Mr. Hulm to approve the business manager's annual report. Motion carried. It was moved by Mrs. Weber and seconded by Mr. Vetter to approve the annual financial report for publication. Motion carried.

An athletic report was given by Mr. Jangula.

No LEA Report. Supt. Schirado gave a student outcome report.

Supt. Schirado updated the board on the summer projects in the school.

The board had the second reading of policy: FFI –Personal Electronic Communication Devices Prohibition During Instructional Time with the

changes recommended in June. After reviewing the policy, it was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mr. Weber to adopt Policy FFI as presented. Motion carried.

This ended the unfinished business for the School District. It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to adjourn this portion of the board meeting.

New Business

Supt. Schirado asked for nominations for President. Mr. Rick Hulm nominated Mrs. Jennifer Vetter with no other nominations, seconded by Mrs. Jahner. Nominations were ceased. It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to cast Mrs. Jennifer Vetter as President. Upon roll call: Jahner "yes"; Corey Vetter "yes"; Hulm "yes"; and Weber "yes". Motion carried. Mrs. Vetter is elected board president for the 2025-2026 school year.

Mr. Weber made a motion to nominate Mr. Rick Hulm as Vice President with no other nominations, seconded by Mrs. Jahner. Nominations were ceased. It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to cast Mr. Hulm as Vice President. Upon roll call: Jahner "yes"; Corey Vetter "yes"; Weber "yes"; and Jennifer Vetter "yes". Motion carried. Mr. Rick Hulm is elected vice president for the 2025-2026 school year.

It was moved by Mrs. Jahner to nominate Mr. Hulm and Mr. Weber to the co-op board for the 2025-2026 school year. Motion was seconded by Mr. Vetter. Upon roll call: Jahner "yes"; Corey Vetter "yes"; and Jennifer Vetter "yes". Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Jahner and seconded by Mr. Weber to approve Bank of North Dakota, BNC National Bank, and Unison Bank as the school district's depositories. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to set the date and time of our board meetings as follows: third Monday of the month at 7:00 PM unless otherwise noted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mr. Hulm to designate the Emmons County Record as the official

paper for the school. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to change the following meal prices: Student breakfast from \$2.35 to \$2.50 and student lunch from \$3.25 to \$3.50; adult breakfast from \$3.25 to \$3.50 and adult lunch from \$4.25 to \$4.50. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mrs. Jahner to approve the activity rates and changes as presented except to change substitute teacher pay from \$140 to \$150 per day. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mr. Vetter to appoint Superintendent Schirado as the Authorized Representative for State and Federal Programs. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Jahner and seconded by Mr. Hulm to appoint Superintendent Schirado as the South Central Prairie Special Education Unit Representative. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mr. Vetter to appoint Counselor Renee Leier as the school's foster care and homeless liaison. Motion carried.

Supt. Schirado presented to the board two proposals from Renaissance Learning. This new platform would be used for assessing students and providing interventions to those that need it. The platform would replace a couple of outdated ones used by the school. It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mr. Weber to approve the three-year proposal from Renaissance Learning. Motion carried.

A letter of resignation was presented from Mrs. Lucinda Haak as the head track coach. For retirement benefits, she needed to resign from all extra-curricular sports. It was moved by Mrs. Jahner and seconded by Mr. Hulm to accept Mrs. Lucinda Haak's resignation as presented. Motion carried.

A letter of resignation was presented from Mrs. Melissa Wolf-Tveito. She is resigning from her teaching position effective immediately. It was moved by Mr. Hulm and seconded by Mr. Weber to accept Mrs. Melissa Wolf-Tveito's

resignation and will pay any remaining salary and personal days while following open record laws and to waive the \$1,500 liquidated damages fee. Motion carried.

A 2025-2026 preliminary budget was reviewed with the board.

The board set Wednesday, September 24th, at 6:00 PM as the date for the school's public hearing meeting.

Supt. Schirado informed the board there is a virtual board boot camp on Thursday, August 7th, via ZOOM, if any board member is interested in the training.

Next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 18th, at 7:00 P.M. with a Be Legendary board guard rail's meeting at 6:00 P.M.

It was moved by Mr. Weber and seconded by Mr. Hulm to adjourn the meeting.
