Vander Vorst's pass on the next possession and returned it 38 yards to the Clipper 10, and on the very next play, Danks ran it in for a 10-yard touchdown that increased the lead to 36-6, and kicked in the continuous clock (30-point margin in second half) for the final 13:50 of the game. Both teams played reserves in the final period, and a 59-yard touchdown run by NT's Samuel Rojas capped the scoring (42-6) with under six minutes left.

NT finished with 309 total yards, with Freeman accounting for 224 of them. Freeman hit on 13 of 20 passes for 199 yards and four touchdowns, and he also rushed for 25 yards on three carries. L. Marshall hauled in eight receptions for 130 yards and a pair of touchdowns for the Eagles.

Strasburg tallied 145 total yards, including 110 on the ground. Van Beek led the way

with 79 yards and a touchdown on 14 rushing attempts, and Brave Bull added 16 yards on seven carries. Vander Vorst completed four of 10 passes for 35 yards with an interception, and Dawson Vander Vorst caught three passes for 13 yards, and Brady Pool hauled in a 22-yard reception for the Clippers.

Strasburg will be idle this week, and the Clippers next game will be Sept. 13, at Mandaree.

NORTH DAKOTA RODEO STAR

Sept. 10, 2025 -On this date in 1953 Frank Whitecalfe was all of two days old. He was born to Oscar and Greta Whitecalfe in Garrison. Little did they realize they had a future rodeo star on their hands. Frank attended White Shield School in Garrison, graduating in 1971. He worked on the family ranch while growing up and started his own cattle herd at age 16.

After attending Dickinson State University for a year, Frank ranched and farmed, then operated a trucking business. But ranching was in his blood, and he returned to it in the early

But what Frank was really known for was rodeo. He won his first state team roping title in 1974, heading with his dad. A well-rounded rodeo star, Frank also participated in calf roping, steer wrestling, bareback riding, and breakaway roping, winning many championships over 40 years.

His first rodeo was the 1970 High School Rodeo in Beulah, winning in bareback riding and team roping. Frank went on to the 1970 and 1971 National High School Finals Rodeo. It was the start of quite a career, as he scored championships in the North Dakota Rodeo association, the Professional Rodeo Cowboys association,

the Roughrider Rodeo Association, the Great Plains Indian Rodeo Association, and he was even World Champion Indian

In addition to being a rodeo star. Frank owned and operated a variety of businesses over the years. He also served his community on various committees and boards.

Frank and his wife Julie had five children. The family lives on the Fort Berthold Reservation, where Frank ranched with his father and brother. Frank says he's learned that it is not always about the championships, but about the memories and lifelong friendships he made along the way.
