Hey snowbirds, think warm thoughts for all of us back here in North Dakota . . . Area residents started the day on Saturday and Sunday with the temperature at -20 degrees, as the marquee indicates at the credit union downtown Kenmare. That brutal cold snap is forecast to end on Wednesday, with a high of 27 degree, then up to 32 degrees for Thursday, and in the 20s Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, before dropping back close to 0 degrees by Monday and Tuesday.

Poll shows support for property tax reform and free school meals

New polling results from North Dakota United indicate strong public support for property tax reform and universal free school meals as top priorities for the State Legislature. The findings also show that two-thirds of North Dakotans oppose using public funds for private school tuition.

These findings are striking," said ND United President Nick Archuleta. "They underscore that universal free school meals are just as important to North Dakotans as property tax reform. These results should be a clear guide for lawmakers. They reflect what we consistently hear from our members: every student should have the opportunity to succeed, and kids can't focus on learning if they're hungry."

"Equally enlightening," he school lunches. continued, "is the overwhelming percentage of North Dakotans who oppose the use of public tax dollars to pay for private school tuition. They know that paying for private school tuition does nothing to improve their local public schools, which more than 90% of North Dakota kids attend. It is clear that over two-thirds of North Dakotans oppose the idea, and I am sure they will let their opposition be known should a bill come forward advocating the use of public dollars for private school tuition."

Key findings from the poll include:

• 81% of respondents support property tax reform.

· 68% oppose public money being used for private school tu-

• Only 10% believe a voucher program would benefit rural and urban families equally.

 Respondents identified teacher recruitment and retention, along with insufficient funding, as two of the biggest challenges facing K-12 education in the state.

The poll was conducted by DFM Research in December 2024 with 600 North Dakota voters.

North Dakota United is the largest professional union of public educators and employees in the state, representing more than 11,000 public school teachers, school staff, university faculty and staff, and • 79% support universal free *city, county and state employees.*
