Students from households whose income is at or below the levels listed in the graph are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Students receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or Special **Nutrition Assistance** Program (SNAP) benefits, or commodity assistance through the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) are eligible for free meal benefits.

School officials use the information on the application only to decide if the students should receive free or reduced-price meals. The information may be released to other federal education programs and state health and education programs. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

Households with any member receiving SNAP, TANF or FDPIR are only required to provide the recipient's name, SNAP, TANF or FDPIR case number, the student's name and an adult signature.

Students who are homeless, runaway or migrant are also eligible for benefits. Household members do not need to be US citizens for students to qualify for benefits.

A local school official will review applications and determine eligibility for free or reduced-price meals. An application that is not completed cannot be approved. A new application must be completed each school year.

If a household does not agree with the decision on the application, the decision may be discussed with the school official on an informal basis. To make a formal appeal, make a request, either orally or in writing, to the school
