


A Look Back... 25 Years Ago

Morris Wins 140-lb Title at Bowman Rotary Tourney

Senior John Morris captured the 140-pound championship in the Bowman Rotary Wrestling tournament this past Saturday. Enroute to the finals, he recorded a pin and a 16-0 technical fall. There, John defeated Lemmon's undefeated Justin Wenner by a 6-3 decision. The only other placer for the Holsteins was sophomore James Holle who took third place honors at 215. Ty Bateman, a 92-pound freshman, and TJ Maher, a 99-pound eighth grader, were 0-2 at 103 and 112 respectively. Zach LeMay 119, Chris Cook 171, Josh Gerhardt 189, and Brock Hager 275, were also 0-2 in the tourney. LeMay is an eighth grader, Cook is a sophomore, Gerhardt, a senior, and Hager is a junior.

Holsteins Look Good Despite Loss

The Holsteins' first game of the 2000 season, also their first game under the tutelage of new boys' basketball coach Brent Lauf, was fairly successful for the Holsteins despite their 5-point loss to the Standing Rock Warriors Friday night, 60-55. The Holsteins kept pace with the Warriors, played good team ball, and showed a great support system with players stepping up in their roles on the floor. The Holsteins trailed at the end of each quarter, but the Warriors had far from a stronghold. Ending score in the first quarter was 16-12,

the Holsteins down by 4. Warriors' guard Ron Walking Elk pulled his team out ahead with 9 of game 19 points in the first quarter, while Marty Doll helped hold up the Holsteins with 7. The Holsteins were down by just one thin point at halftime, 25-24. By halftime they had already shot 22 free throws, making 12, and the Warriors were digging themselves into foul trouble. The Warriors out-scored the Holsteins 19-18 in the quarter to gain another point in the lead, now 44-42. Of the Holsteins' 18 in the third quarter, guard Luke Sturn pitched in 7 and senior center Jeb Olson 6. The Holsteins still had a chance with one whole quarter left to play, but the Warriors made some crucial free throws which gave them the edge. They upped their score by 16 in the final quarter.

By the time the game ended, the Warriors had a number of players in foul trouble. Starting forward Jeremy Thunder Hawk left the game in the fourth with 5 fouls, while teammates Cody Two Bears, Skyler White Temple, Jim Archambault, and Richard Crow Ghost all had 4 and several players also had 3 fouls against them. The Holsteins were 21 of 46 from the line for a free throw percentage of 46 percent, while the opposing Warriors were 13 of 20 for 65 percent. New Salem scoring saw Sturn with 20 points in the game, Doll with 13 and Olson 8. Adding 6 points was Kelly Klemisch, teammates Lafe Nelson and Matt Klingenstein each with 3 and Josh Eggers with a couple of free throws. Ron Walking Elk was the scoring leader for the Warriors with 19 points in the game.
