Andes Mint Cookies Recipe:

Ingredients:

2 C. all-purpose flour

²/₃ C. unsweetened cocoa powder

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

3/4 C. unsalted butter, room temp

3/4 C. light brown sugar, packed

3/4 C. white sugar

2 large eggs

2 tsp. pure vanilla extract

36 Andes chocolate mints, unwrapped

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Line a large baking sheet with a Slipmat baking mat or parchment paper and set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, cocoa powder, baking soda and salt and set aside.

In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, beat the butter and sugars on medium high speed until light and creamy, about two minutes. Mix in the eggs and vanilla extract scraping down the side of the bowl with a spatula, as necessary. Add in the dry ingredients and mix on low until just combined - don't over mix.

Scoop by rounded Tablespoons onto the prepared baking sheet, placing the dough balls about two-inches

Bake for 8-10 minutes or until the cookies are set around the edges but still soft in the center. Remove the baking sheet from the oven and gently press a mint into the center of each cookie. Let the cookies sit on the baking sheet for five minutes or until the mint is soft and melty. Take a butter knife and carefully spread the melted mint over the top of the cookie, leaving a little border. The mint will become the frosting

Transfer the cookies to a cooling rack and cool completely so the frosting can set up.

Note: store in an airtight container at room temperature up to four days.

Jaguars, Smith reinforced the Holsteins desire to be a defense first team, adding how the physicality of Tuesday's game provided the team with a chance to prove their defensive prowess.

Though successful in forcing countless turnovers on defense throughout the game, the Holsteins had plenty of chances to score points in transition but also turned the ball over throughout the first half.

Coach Kringstad shared that with more in-game reps and minutes, his players will begin limiting the number of turnovers they commit in a game. Smith said that in order to limit turnovers, the team needs to remain calm when maintaining possession of the ball, emphasizing the need to not rush passes and jump stops.

"We're still early in the season so that's something we know we got to improve on but just [on] a week-by-week basis we should get a little more comfortable with what we're doing and not have to overthink," Coach Kringstad explained. "A lot of times turnovers are overcomplicating things and not just being reactionary so week by week we hope that number goes down."

The starting lineup of the Holsteins aside from Smith, (Maksim Nelson, Miller, Gilbert and Sanders) contributed 39 points in the win. After having multiple double-digit scorers in the season opener, Coach Kringstad said it was nice to see other players getting involved and finding opportunities for themselves aside from Smith.

Following his 29-point

performance, Smith said he was "grateful for the opportunities" he received throughout the game to contribute offensively, something Coach Kringstad stated he and others on the team will continue to get throughout the season.

"He's [Smith] a great offensive player, but there's eventually going to be teams [when] we get deep in the season, they're going to scout and try to take him away and make things difficult. We need other guys that are going to step up and find opportunities,' Coach Kringstad said.

Coach Kringstad noted that it's still too early for him to know the team's best rotation of players, but he emphasized how the coaches will continue to view and consider in-game fouls, fatigue and overall performance when deciding rotations.
