Havana Bank robbers in 1933

Things were going bad for the Havana State Bank in the spring and summer of 1933.

Havana is a small town in Sergeant County but had a bank in 1933 when the institution became a target of bank robbers.

Over a period of two months, the bank was robbed twice by the same trio of thieves.

Reports of the incident come from the assistant bank cashier who was a witness, and victim, to both crimes.

She said that in the second incident, the crooks pulled up in front of the bank. One stayed in the car while the other two entered the bank building and pulled guns. When she was told to lie on the floor, she immediately recognized the voice as the earlier bank robber.

"We haven't as much money in the bank as we had the last time you were here," she was quoted in newspapers around the state as saying.

The bank robber, maybe he was a businessman

or a bit of an economist, reportedly said, "I realize that." The crooks cleaned out the bank of about

\$800. This was well below the \$7,800 they'd taken during the April robbery. Once they had the money, the crooks forced

the assistant cashier to go with them and stand on the running boards of the getaway car. This was a common bank robber tactic to keep any local law enforcement officers from shooting at

At the edge of Havana, which I can't believe was that far from the downtown bank, the

woman was released and the bank robbers fled. The Sargent County sheriff's office investi-

gated and did have some leads to work. Witness reports said the car had Minnesota plates, was a relatively new Ford V-8 with red wheels and was believed to be headed south

towards Britton, South Dakota. I don't believe the Havana bank thieves were ever apprehended.

But we can assume they didn't rob the bank a third time.

After all, they only got 10% of their first haul in the second. They probably wouldn't have even broke even if they had robbed the bank a third time during the Great Depression.

Ringstad provided staffing updates and reported on his attendance at superintendent and finance meetings. The district was also informed of the cancellation of the ND CLIMBS Grant.

Rall provided a written report including: legal clarification requires students to pay for in-house NDCDE courses, though enforcement is paused this year; the Pledge of Allegiance will be recited during 1st hour; ND COUNTS PD is required for grades 4-8 this year; human trafficking prevention education will be

provided in grades 6, 10, and 12; a formal Virtual School policy is being developed; a new state-developed Engagement Survey will be used; tech updates include new stage mics, pending lighting and switch installs, and a new server; a Homeland Security grant was submitted. with camera installation planned for fall.

Radermacher reported on projected enrollment and new staff. Schedule changes at EES include shifting 3rd-5th recess to after lunch and moving 4th-5th math/reading to the morning. At MRC, classroom groupings were

adjusted due to staffing, with full-time aides added and 8th graders taking NDCDE courses. Preschool will continue at EPS under the same setup as last

Norton reported that EPS has received several donations for the addition, including \$15,562.25 from the Ellendale Peewee Wrestling Club and \$1,650 from the Class of '75 for the wrestling room; and \$1,000 in memory of Lenny Grimm, \$821.84 from the Class of 2025, and \$500 from Nickie Frigen in memory of Don and Carol Frigen for fitness center equipment. NDPHIT has also updated its participation agreement regarding contract terminations. Vance reported on coaching open-

ings. Fall sports are underway and Hudl streaming cameras are fully installed, with support from local businesses donating to help cover costs. The board reviewed the committee as-

signments for the 25-26 school year. Wagner moved, with a second by Gilbert, to set the 2025-2026 instrument rental fee at \$25. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.
