I wanted to take a moment to update you on some of the great work we’ve accomplished around our school building to ensure everything is running smoothly and efficiently.
Here are a few of the projects we’ve completed:

- **Roof Maintenance:** We sealed the roof of the 1937 building and also sealed and patched the elementary building. In addition, we resealed the seams where the elementary and 1937 buildings connect. We’re pleased to report that we’ve had no leaks, and we remain committed to maintaining our roofs throughout the entire school.
- **Bathroom Renovations:** We fully renovated all four bathrooms in the 1937 building. This included new lighting, updated plumbing, new sinks, partitions, and flooring. The updates were much needed, and both staff and students are thrilled with the results.
- **Flooring Updates:** We installed new flooring in the north hallway and in the FCS hallway that runs perpendicular to it. This has modernized that wing of the building and significantly improved its appearance.
- **Science Room Upgrade:** Our high school science room received new flooring and renovated lab stations to better support our outstanding science programs. This space now

better reflects the quality of education happening inside it.

- **CTE Building Success:** Our new Career and Technical Education (CTE) building continues to be a tremendous asset. I want to remind everyone that the District owns this new addition, and North Valley rents space from us. The building houses programs in Agricultural Education, Business IT, Health Sciences, and Building Trades. It has been a fantastic addition, both physically and academically, and our students love the opportunities it provides.

Our governing board has approved these renovations with a focus on long-term budgetary gains and the continued improvement of our facilities. The new waxless tile flooring installed in the north hallway will require only general cleaning, significantly reducing time and labor costs associated with traditional waxing maintenance. Additionally, by repairing our roofs, we are protecting the integrity of our building from water damage, allowing us to continue making upgrades throughout the facility. These preventative measures help preserve our infrastructure and support responsible financial planning. These decisions reflect our commitment to using our resources wisely and investing in the future of Cavalier Public School.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO PERFORM CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR PEMBINA COUNTY

Pembina County is requesting the services of qualified engineering firms to perform the construction engineering on the following projects in Pembina County scheduled to be completed in 2026.
— Inslope Improvements on CMC 3411 (Pembina County Highway 12) in Leroy, ND.
— Inslope Improvements on CMC 3404 (Pembina County Highway 55) 2.5 miles West of ND Hwy 18.
Key project elements include inslope flattening and erosion control blanket at each location.
Work to be performed by Consultant includes:
Construction Services: Perform Project Management, Project Administration, Construction Observation, Construction Survey, Materials Testing, and Final Record Keeping. The work will need to follow NDDOT standards and procedures. Additional services, if required, may be negotiated and supplemental agreements issued based on the consultant’s performance, the consultant’s proposal and available funding.
Firms are invited to submit a proposal for the project listed above. The Proposals shall provide the following information:

- Past Performance
 - Ability of professional personnel
 - Willingness to meet time and budget requirements
 - Location
 - Recent, current, and projected work-loads of the persons and/or firms
 - Related experience on similar projects
 - Recent and current work for the County
 - Project understanding, issues, & approach.
- The proposal pages shall be numbered and must be limited to 10 pages in length. Proposals that exceed the 10 page length requirement will not be considered. The cover letter will not be counted as one of the 10 pages. The proposal should list the personnel who will be assigned to work on the project, including titles, education, and work experience. Pembina County will only consider proposals received prior to 2:00 PM, August 4, 2025. Late proposals will be deemed unresponsive.
- The consultant’s proposal may include an appendix. Resumes, references, a statement of qualifications and other materials outlining experience may be included in an appendix. The appendix will not be considered as a part of the 10 page proposal. Each proposal will be evaluated by a selection committee.
- Pembina County will conduct interviews. The County plans to interview up to three (3) of the most qualified engineering firms based on whose proposals most clearly meet the RFP requirements. Interviews will take place on a date to be determined by the County. Firms not selected to be interviewed will be notified in writing.
- Fees shall be negotiated with the successful firm. If the fee cannot be agreed upon, the County reserves the right to terminate negotiations, and then negotiate with the second and third ranked firms in order, if necessary, until a satisfactory contract has been negotiated.
- All costs associated with the proposal shall be borne by the proposer. The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all proposals and to not award contracts for any and/or all projects.

TAKE NOTICE that the Department of Water Resources has initiated the cancellation process for a portion of Perfected Water Permit No. 5566 for three or more years of successive non-use. The permit is held by STREMECK, KATHY, MARK & JEFFREY, for the annual use of 129.0 acre-feet of water from Wieler Dam Reservoir for Irrigation purposes. The authorized pumping rate is 540 gallons per minute. The priority date is March 20, 2002. The points of diversion are the NE1/4 of Section 29, and W1/2SE1/4 of Section 20, all of T. 162 N., R. 056 W., Pembina County. The land irrigated under this permit is 132.0 acres in the NE1/4 of Section 20, T. 162 N., R. 056 W., Pembina County.
