A bidder's bond must be executed by the bidder as principal and by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of North Dakota, conditioned that if the principal's bid is accepted and the contract awarded to the principal, the principal, within ten (10) days after notice of the award, shall execute a contract in accordance with the terms of the bid and the bid bond as required by the laws of the State of North Dakota and the regulations and determinations of the governing body, and any condition of the

Owner. Countersignature of a bid bond is not required under this section. If the Owner elects to award a contract to the lowest responsible bidder, and the lowest responsible bidder does not execute a contract within the ten (10) days allowed, the bidder's bond must be forfeited to the Owner and the project awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder. - All work shall be complete and ready for final payment on or before **October 9th, 2026**.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any informality in any bid, and to accept the bid deemed most favorable to the interest of the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to hold all bids for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days from the date of Bid Opening. No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days.

Contracts shall be awarded on the basis of the low bids submitted by responsible and responsive bidders for the aggregate sum of bid items for bids received by each Bidder. Up to twelve (12) Prime contracts may be awarded for the work with up to three (3) contracts for General, Mechanical, and Electrical at each of the four (4) project site locations.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish Contract Performance and Payment Bonds in the full amount of the contract.

Should the **Prime General Contractor** fail to complete the Work within the time required herein or within such extra time as may have been granted by formal extensions of time approved by the Owner, there will be deducted from any amount due the Contractor the sum of **\$500.00 per day per installation location** for each and every day that expires after such completion of Substantial Completion is delayed, and an additional **\$500.00 per day per installation location** for each and every day that expires after such final completion is delayed.

If separate Prime Agreements are executed for Electrical or Mechanical work, there will be deducted from any amount due the Prime Mechanical or Electrical Contractor the sum of **\$100.00 per day per installation location** for each and every day that expires after such completion of Substantial Completion is delayed, and an additional **\$100.00 per day per installation location** for each and every day that expires after such final completion is delayed. The Contractor and their surety will be liable for any excess. Such Payment will be as and for liquidated damages. Said reduction in payment only applies to the individual installation location(s) at which final completion is delayed.
