The landfill use agreement for contractors that have full time access was reviewed, Hollingsworth moved, Day second to begin using the agreement, carried. The public works crew is still having issues with the sand truck after multiple attempts to fix the problems.

A streetlight near Burlwood was damaged due to a car accident, Parson's electric will be reaching out with an estimate to replace the light pole. Chief O'Brien informed the council that Officer Toepke completed firearms training and is now certified to qualify the other officers. First Noel event was a success, 44 kids benefited from the program. The rain gutter was installed on the south side of the building, now the ceiling in the meeting room will need to be repaired. Street signage around town was discussed, several signs are damaged or aged. Inquired if Moore Engineering was aware of any standards for placement or analysis used to determine what type of sign is appropriate at intersections. Reber will research and provide any information he finds. There is a pickup in cold storage from an accident, the case has cleared the court system. Hollingsworth moved, Kelly second to direct Attorney F. Kelly to take necessary action to sell/ auction the vehicle, carried. The state has announced that all first responders must order their new radios by March of 2025. It was asked if there are city funds that could be utilized by all first responder entities, such as Prairie Dog Funds or Sales Tax Funds. F. Kelly will review the ordinance in relation to use of sales and lodging taxes. A full review of City Ordinances was discussed, F. Kelly has completed this process for other cities in the past, he will provide an estimate of cost as this is outside the scope of his regular monthly duties. The John Deere Loader one year warranty is almost up, they reached out regarding an inspection to ensure there are no issues that could be covered before the warranty ends. Kelly moved. Hernandez-Waite second to approve the payloader inspection, car-

Unfinished Business:

One bid for the City owned lots was received and opened, the bid for \$7,000 included a contingency that water and to the lots if not already available. The business plan is for office and retail space on the ground floor with one or

Hollingsworth moved, Kelly second to accept the bid, motion failed. After discussion Hollingsworth moved, Day second to accept the contingent bid with a City contingency as follows: bidder must apply and obtain a building permit by May 1st, 2025 and commence construction by September 1st, 2025 upon penalty of reverter to the City, carried. Remaining SLFRF (ARPA) funds must be obligated by December 31st, Day moved, Kelly second to obligate the funds to the street improvement project, carried. New Business: Employee

Appreciation: Day moved, Hollingsworth second to present full and part-time employees with Oakes Bucks in appreciation of their work throughout the year, carried. Cost of Living adjustments were discussed, Mayor Sitzler inquired about annual reviews, at this time they are not done as previous councils determined any employee issues are dealt with at the time they occur and to not wait to address them during an annual review. This council would like to revisit that in 2025 and possibly reinstate annual reviews. Hollingsworth moved, Day second to approve a 4% cost of living adjustment for 2025 for all employees, carried.
