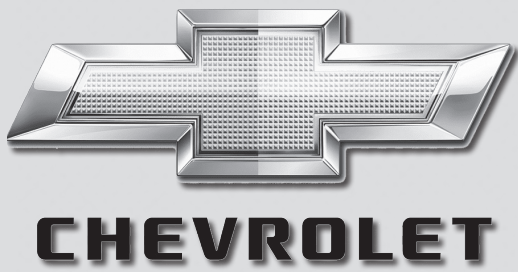

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

DEFAULT - Failure to fulfill an obligation to make payments when due to a lender.
ENCUMBRANCE - A right attached to the property of another that may lessen its value, such as a lien, mortgage or easement.
FORECLOSURE - The legal process of terminating an owner's interest in property, usually as the result of a default under a mortgage. Foreclosure may be accomplished by order of a court or by the statutory process known as foreclosure by advertisement, also known as a power of sale foreclosure.
LIEN - A legal claim asserted against the property of another, usually as security for a debt or obligation.
MORTGAGE - A lien granted by the owner of property to provide security for a debt or obligation.

POWER OF SALE - A clause commonly written into a mortgage authorizing the mortgagee to advertise and sell the property by event or default. The process is governed by statute, but is supervised by any court.
PROBATE - The court procedure in which a decedent's liabilities are settled and his/her assets are distributed to his/her heirs.
PUBLIC NOTICE - Notice given to the public or persons affected by regarding certain types of legal proceedings, usually by placing in a newspaper or general circulation. This notice is usually required in matters that concern the public.

Electronic Bids, subject to the conditions contained herein, for improvements to the Bottineau Municipal Airport Authority, Bottineau, North Dakota, AIG Project

No. 3-38-0004-022-2025 will be received online by the Bottineau Municipal Airport Authority through the www.hubexo.com (formally www.questcdn.com e-bid process until 2:00 PM central time on April 30, 2025, and then publicly opened and read aloud.

Project work consists of but is not limited to the following: Foundation demolition, beacon tower relocation, electrical vault relocation, foundation construction, painting, directional boring, and electrical construction.

Construction for this project is to take place over 21 calendar days between the dates of August 11, 2025, and October 10, 2025.

Contract Documents. The complete set of Plans, Specifications, and Contract Documents can be obtained for a non-refundable fee of \$200.00 at the office of Mead & Hunt, Inc. located at 2505 N. University Drive, Suite 100, Fargo, ND 58102 or may be downloaded for a fee of \$25 at [#9614412](http://www.hubexo.com). Those wishing to download the bidding documents electronically, do so at their own risk for completeness of the bidding documents.

Bidding. Each bid must be accompanied by a separate envelope containing the contractor's license and bid security (the e-bid process will be set up to meet this requirement). The bid security must be in a sum equal to five percent of the full amount of the bid and must be in the form of a bidder's bond. A bidder's bond must be executed by the bidder as principal and by a surety, conditioned that if the principal's bid is accepted and the contract awarded to the principal, the principal, within ten days after notice of the award, shall execute a contract in accordance with the terms of the bid and the bid bond and any condition of the governing body. If a successful bidder does not execute a contract within the ten days allowed, the bidder's bond must be forfeited to the governing body and the project awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder.

The airport reserves the right to reject any and all bids and rebid the project. No bid will be read or considered if the bid does not fully comply with the bidding requirements. Deficient bids will be resealed and returned to the bidder.

Federal Requirements for Federally Funded Projects. This Project is being partially funded under the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) AIG Program. Contractors must comply with specific federally required provisions as listed herein and contained in the contract documents. The following federal provisions are incorporated in this solicitation by reference:

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. The requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 apply to this contract. It is the policy of the Bottineau Municipal Airport Authority to practice nondiscrimination based on race, color, sex, or national origin in the award or performance of this contract. The owner encourages participation by all firms qualifying under this solicitation regardless of business size or ownership.

Federal Fair Labor Standards Act. All contracts and subcontracts that result from this solicitation incorporate by reference the provisions of 29 CFR part 201, et seq, the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), with the same force and effect as if given in full text. The FLSA sets minimum wage, overtime pay, recordkeeping, and child labor standards for full and part-time workers.

The Contractor has full responsibility to monitor compliance to the referenced statute or regulation. The Contractor must address any claims or disputes that arise from this requirement directly with the U.S. Department of Labor - Wage and Hour Division.

Trade Restriction Certification. By submission of an offer, the Offeror certifies that with respect to this solicitation and any resultant contract, the Offeror -

- 1) is not owned or controlled by one or more citizens of a foreign country included in the list of countries that discriminate against U.S. firms as published by the Office of the United States Trade Representative (U.S.T.R.).
- 2) has not knowingly entered into any contract or subcontract for this project with a person that is a citizen or national of a foreign country included on the list of countries that discriminate against U.S. firms as published by the USTR; and
- 3) has not entered into any subcontract for any product to be used on the Federal project that is produced in a foreign country included on the list of countries that discriminate against U.S. firms published by the USTR.

This certification concerns a matter within the jurisdiction of an agency of the United States of America and the making of a false, fictitious, or fraudulent certification may render the maker subject to

The Offeror/Contractor must provide immediate written notice to the Owner if the Offeror/Contractor learns that its certification or that of a subcontractor was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances. The Contractor must require subcontractors provide immediate written notice to the Contractor if at any time it learns that its certification was erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.

Unless the restrictions of this clause are waived by the Secretary of Transportation in accordance with 49 CFR § 30.17, no contract shall be awarded to an Offeror or subcontractor:

The Offeror agrees that, if awarded a contract resulting from this solicitation, it will incorporate this provision for certification without modification in all lower tier subcontracts. The Contractor may rely on the certification of a prospective subcontractor that it is not a firm from a foreign country included on the list of countries that discriminate against U.S. firms as published by USTR, unless the Offeror has knowledge that the certification is erroneous.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when making an award. If it is later determined that the Contractor or subcontractor

knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) may direct through the Owner cancellation of the contract or subcontract for default at no cost to the Owner or the FAA.
