This intensive course is designed for cattle producers, feeders, backgrounders, feed industry personnel, animal health care suppliers and anyone interested in learning more about feedlot production, nutrition, waste management and marketing.

"Cattle feeding is a very competitive business," says Karl Hoppe, NDSU Extension livestock systems specialist at the Carrington Research Extension Center. "Making cattle feeding profitable is usually a result of doing many things right, not just one thing better."

The feedlot school helps identify areas for improvement, ranging from feed bunk management

to health to business planning and
