

# Enrollment grows as NDSU's strategic changes reshape the future

North Dakota State University is seeing a first-day enrollment increase this fall, welcoming 11,954 students, a one percent increase compared to the same day last year when enrollment was stabilizing. This includes a three percent increase in first-time freshman, a three percent increase in transfer students, and a one percent increase in graduate enrollment.

While official enrollment will be finalized on census day, Sept. 22, the early numbers offer a glimpse into the impact of recent initiatives and the energy surrounding the start of the academic year.

The enrollment growth follows years of intentional work to strengthen NDSU's academic and operational foundation. The university has made difficult but necessary decisions regarding academic programming to better align with student demand and workforce needs. These efforts reflect a broader strategy to ensure long-term sustainability and collective work to support student success and strengthen recruitment efforts.

NDSU saw a three percent increase in engineering students this fall. That progress is expected to continue next year with the opening of the \$100 million Offerdahl Complex, a state-of-the-art facility designed to support hands-on learning, interdisciplinary collaboration, and cutting-edge research. The complex will be ready for students in fall 2026 and represents a major investment in the future of engineering education at NDSU.

The university also saw a 60 percent increase in online-only students and a 55 percent increase in new undergraduate international students. Scheduled credit hours rose slightly to 154,560, and the overall student body remains 80 percent full-time and 20 percent part-time, consistent with last year.

This fall, 4,075 students are living on campus in residence halls and university apartments, contributing to a vibrant and engaged campus community.

NDSU graduated 200 more students in 2024–25 than the previous academic year, contributing to a growing presence of Bison alumni in the workforce. These graduates are helping meet critical workforce needs across the state in fields like healthcare, engineering, education and agriculture, reinforcing NDSU's role as North Dakota's land-grant institution and a key driver of talent development and economic vitality.

As the semester begins, NDSU continues to live out its mission as a student-focused, land-grant, research university that serves our citizens. Through access to education, hands-on discovery, and a strong sense of community, students are empowered to shape the future.

# North Dakota Unveils ND250 Logo as Countdown to America's 250th Anniversary Begins

With just less than a year until the national spotlight shines on the U.S.' 250th birthday on July 4, 2026, the ND250 Commission has officially unveiled the new ND250 logo. This marks the launch of North Dakota's plans to celebrate America's Semiquincentennial in a way that honors democracy, community, and state pride.

The ND250 badge-style logo is rich with North Dakota symbolism. From the bold prairie horizon and rising sun to the standing wheat and iconic western meadowlark, each element reflects the people, landscapes, and values that define the Peace Garden State. Organizations are encouraged to use this logo to promote events related to ND250. Logo guidelines and PDFs can be found at ND250.com.



"ND250 is a moment for every community to reflect on what we've built together and where we go next," said Bill Peterson, State Historical Society of North Dakota director and ND250 commission chair. "This logo represents not just our history, but also our hope for the raising of North Dakota's voices in a national celebration of democracy."

**North Dakotans Already Joining the Celebration**

While the ND250 Commission is rolling out the new logo and website, North Dakotans are already making their mark on the celebration. Korri C., a 10th grader from Drake, has been named one of 150 national awardees in the America's Field Trip contest, a nationwide America250 initiative inviting students to share their vision of America's story. Her inspiring submission answered the question, "What does America mean to you?" Korri was a second-place winner and will receive a \$500 award.

Beyond Korri's achievement, communities across the state are planning events and activities to mark this milestone, including the grand opening of the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library, and the Red River Valley Genealogical Society's Writings of Family History, Stories and Memories to name just a couple.

Events and initiatives can be found and contributed at ND250.com. The commission is encouraging all North Dakotans to take ownership of the celebration, inspired by the many memories shared from the nation's Bicentennial 50 years ago. "The stories we've heard from 1976 remind us of the pride and unity that came from that moment," added Peterson. "We want the Semiquincentennial to spark that same feeling for a new generation."

# Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo Returns

Tickets on sale for regional championship for PRCA rodeo

Tickets are on sale for the Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo, to be held October 10-12 in Minot, N.D. at the North Dakota State Fair Center.

The circuit finals rodeo is the culmination of the rodeos in North Dakota and South Dakota and features the top twelve cowboys or cowgirls in each of eight events, who have won the most money over the season.

The Circuit Finals is the best of the best, said Max Wepler, chairman of the Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo. "They're the best cowboys and cowgirls in North Dakota and South Dakota, plus surrounding states," he said. "Fans will see top-notch rodeo competition."

The rodeo will also include high-level entertainment, including rodeo clown Dennis Halstead and announcers Bob Tallman and Garrison Allen.

Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo champions go on to qualify for the NFR Open, held in Colorado Springs in July. Monies earned at circuit finals count towards the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, the PRCA's world championship event. Last year, the Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo paid out nearly \$250,000 to the winners.

Performances start at 7 pm on Oct. 10-11 and at 1 pm on Oct. 12.

Tickets are \$35 for reserved seating (the five rows closest to the arena floor). General admission tickets are \$25 for adults and \$12.50 for children ages 2-12.
