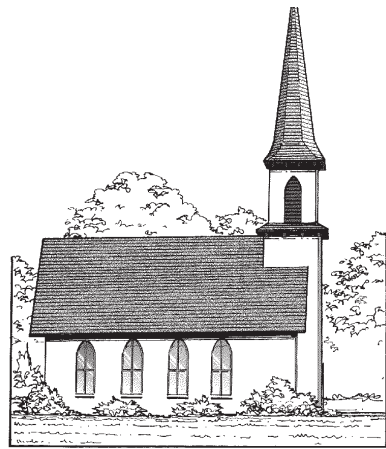

Along the Red Trail North Dakota's most Historic Highway

Schlosser Pass By: Bennett Kubischta, President Old Red Old Ten Scenic Byway

As we travel on I-94 between Sweet Briar Lake and Exit 140 the roadway ascends to the top of a ridge. In the early 1970s, as I was beginning my career with the ND State Highway Department, fellow highway men told me that this location was known as Schlosser Pass.

The story was that Joseph (Joe) Schlosser carried his transit to the top of the hill. Then, while observing the land to the east and the land to the west, Joe found the spot he wanted. At this spot

that ridgeline because at that time, with the construction equipment available to them, they followed the route that was the easiest to build.

A few years ago, I wanted to find evidence if the story of Schlosser Pass was verifiable. The Records Center of the North Dakota Department of Transportation has original survey books of most all of their projects. In those files is

Schlosser said “Here’s where we’re going” and he set up his transit and established where I-94 would cross this ridge.

In the 1910s and 1920s when the road between Mandan and New Salem was developed the route headed north out of Mandan on 6th Avenue Northwest. After it crested Mandan Hill it headed in a westerly direction for about 10 miles where a ridgeline was encountered. To avoid this ridge the alignment turned to the southwest for about one mile and then west on to New Salem.

When I-94 was built across North Dakota the greatest vertical barrier to cross was this ridgeline that was avoided by the highway builders of the early 20th Century. Those highway builders avoided

the preliminary survey book for the segment between New Salem and ND 25. This survey was conducted in 1961 between January and March. The Crew Chief of the preliminary survey party was Joe Schlosser.

Joe was born in New Leipzig on January 25, 1906. He was raised in Carson and was one of the original basketball players on Neil Churchill’s Bismarck Phantoms team. He lived single all of his life and died in Bismarck on February 4, 1984.

I believe that Joe Schlosser did what they said he did and that we should always remember him as we drive over Schlosser Pass. Goodbye for now. Remember, promoting the Old Red Old Ten promotes our towns, and always take time to talk to the cows.
